REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE, AT ST. JAMES'S-PALACE.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's-Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence-chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to Her Majesty.

Those Gentlemen who are to be presented are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to present them, should be sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, on the *Monday previous* to the Levee on the 3rd of March next, *before twelve o'clock*, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall be made at the Levee but in conformity with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to the Queen.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until half-past one o'clock.

Notice is hereby given, that all persons having Petitions or Addresses to present to Her Majesty at the Levee, are to send a card (having on it their names, a statement of the object of such Petitions or Addresses, and the names of the persons from whom they come) to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, *before twelve o'clock*, on the *Monday previous* to the Levee on the 3rd of March next; and that two other cards, having on them precisely what is written upon that sent to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, are to be taken to

the Levee; one of the two cards to be delivered to the Page in the Ante-Room, and the other to the Lord Chamberlain, who will read its contents to Her Majesty; and, on these occasions, no other statement is to be addressed to Her Majesty.

A Deputation to present an Address is not to exceed four persons.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the first section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament, holden in the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to authorize the division of the parish of Manchester into several parishes, and for the application of the revenues of the collegiate and parish church, and for other purposes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of January one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, in the words following; viz:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent to your Majesty, that the parish of Manchester, in the county palatine of Lancaster, is of very great extent, and contains a very large population:

"That, in addition to the cathedral church of the diocese of Manchester, many new churches or chapels have at various times been erected within the said parish of Manchester, to one of which new churches or chapels, called 'The Church of Saint Thomas, Heaton Norris,' a district chapelry was assigned under the provisions of the Church Building Acts, or one of them, and on the representation of your Majesty's said Commissioners, and by virtue of, and in conformity to, an Order of your Majesty in Council, dated the fourteenth

day of September one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight:

"That in the fourteenth year of Your Majesty's reign an Act of Parliament was passed, intituled 'An Act to authorize the division of the parish of Manchester into several parishes, and for the application of the revenues of the collegiate and parish church, and for other purposes:'

"That a new church within the said parish of Manchester has been consecrated since the passing of the said last-mentioned Act, by the name of 'The Church of Saint John the Baptist, Heaton Mersey,' and such new church has been built, and is situate within the said district chapelry so assigned to the said church of Saint Thomas, Heaton Norris, as aforesaid, but the same was not built in pursuance of the provisions of an Act, passed in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign for making better provisions for the spiritual care of populous parishes:

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending the said parish of Manchester, and the said district chapelry, and the said new church, it appears to them to be expedient that under the provisions of the first section of the said Act, passed in the fourteenth year of your Majesty's reign, a district parish, to be taken wholly out of the said district chapelry, which was so assigned to the church of Saint Thomas, Heaton Norris, as aforesaid, should be set out, declared, and constituted for, and annexed to, the said church of Saint John, Heaton Mersey, and should be severed and disannexed from the said parish of Manchester, and from the said district chapelry so assigned to the said church of Saint Thomas, Heaton Norris, and that such district parish, so to be set out and constituted, should be named 'The District Parish of Saint John, Heaton Mersey,' with boundaries as follows; (that is to say): the said district parish to commence at the south-western extremity of the township of Heaton Norris, on the river Mersey, at a point where the said township touches a detached piece of meadow land, belonging to the parish of Cheadle, thence to proceed in an easterly direction along the middle of the said river Mersey, pursuing the old bed of the said river to where it touches the parliamentary and municipal boundary of the borough of Stockport, then following the said boundary to Travisbrow, then in a northerly direction along the middle of the Green-lane to where the said lane meets Moor-lane, then along the middle of Green-lane aforesaid in a westerly direction to Broomfield, thence in a north-easterly direction along the middle of Teddy High-lane to Shaw Brook, thence along the middle of Shaw Brook in a north-westerly direction to where the same brook crosses the township boundary, and enters the township of Burnage, thence along the township boundary of Heaton Norris in a south-westerly direction to the point from whence the boundary of the said district parish commenced at the river Mersey, at the south-western extremity, and which said district parish is delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon tinted green:

"That the consent of the Right Reverend James Prince, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester, has been obtained thereto, as required by the above-mentioned section of the said Act, passed in the fourteenth year of your Majesty's reign, in testimony whereof the said bishop has signed and sealed this present scheme or instrument.

"And whereas the draft of the said scheme has been transmitted to the incumbent and to the patrons of the church of the said district chapelry

of Heaton Norris, out of which it is intended that the district herein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, and whereas such incumbent and patrons have respectively consented to the said scheme :

"Your Majesty's Commissioners therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the foregoing scheme into your royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto, as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof; and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed constitution and assignment of a district be accordingly made and carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith enrolled, pursuant to the said Act, and registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Manchester.
