### TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of postage," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty's Postmaster-General to charge on all letters conveyed by the post between places within any of Her Majesty's colonies, or conveyed by packet-boats, between one part of Her Ma-jesty's dominions and another part of the same dominions, or between Her Majesty's dominions and foreign parts, or between one port in any foreign country and another port in the same or any other foreign country where post communications shall be established, and where rates of postage have not hitherto been authorized by law; and also to charge on all letters conveyed by any vessels to or from any of the colonies, or between any of the colonies, or between any of the colonies and a foreign port, and on all letters which shall be brought by the master of any vessel to the Post-office in any of the colonies such rates of postage as the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by warrant under their hands, shall from time to time direct:

And by the same Act, power is given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British or inland postage payable by law on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters, or newspapers, or any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof, and a scale of weight to be contained in such warrant, and from time to time, by warrant as aforesaid, to alter or repeal any such altered rates, and to make and establish any new or other rates in lieu thereof, and, by warrant as aforesaid, to appoint at what time the rates that might be payable were to be paid; and it is provided that the power thereby given to alter and fix rates of postage, should extend to any increase, or reduction, or remission of postage:

And whereas it is expedient that further regulations should be made for the transmission by the post of the letters and newspapers hereinafter mentioned:

Now we, the undersigned, being two of the

Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do, in exercise of the power or authority in us for such purpose vested in and by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, by this warrant under our hands, direct, that on every letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight, posted in or addressed to any of the Danish colonies in the West Indies, and transmitted by the post between any place in the United Kingdom and any port or place in such colonies (the sea conveyance being by British packet-boats) there shall be charged and taken, in lieu of any rates of British postage now payable by law on such letters, an uniform British rate of one

shilling.

And we further direct, that on every letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight, posted in or addressed to any of the Danish colonies in the West Indies, and transmitted by British packetboat between any ports in such colonies, or be-tween any of such colonies and any port in the British West Indies, or any port in Martinique, Guadaloupe, Venezuela, or New Granada, without in any case such letters passing through the United Kingdom, there shall be charged and taken, in lieu of any rates of British postage now payable by law on such letters, an uniform British rate of

And we further direct, that on every letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight, posted in or addressed to any of the Danish colonies in the West Indies, and transmitted by British packetboats, viâ Panama, between any of such colonies and any port or place on the western coast of South America, without passing through the United Kingdom, there shall be charged and taken, in lieu of any rates of British postage now payable by law on such letters, an uniform British rate of one shilling and four pence.

And we direct, that on every letter transmitted as is mentioned in this warrant, exceeding half an ounce in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid, progressive and additional rates of

postage as follows (that is to say):

On every such letter exceeding half an ounce in weight, and not exceeding one ounce in weight, two rates of postage.

On every such letter exceeding one ounce, and not exceeding two ounces in weight, four rates of postage.

On every such letter exceeding two ounces, and not exceeding three ounces in weight, six rates of postage.

And on every such letter exceeding three ounces, and not exceeding four ounces in weight, eight

rates of postage.

And for every ounce in weight above the weight of four ounces, there shall be charged and taken two additional rates of postage, and every fraction of an ounce above the weight of four ounces shall be charged as one additional ounce, and each progressive and additional rate chargeable under this clause shall be estimated and charged at the sum which any such letter would be charged with under this warrant if not exceeding half an ounce in weight.

And we further direct, that such printed newspapers as are hereinafter mentioned, may be sent by the post according to the regulations and rates hereinafter set forth, which rates shall be in lieu of any rates of British postage now payable by law on such newspapers (that is to say):

Newspapers between any of Her Majestyls colonies and the United States of America through the United Kingdom by the closed mail, via Marseilles, the sea conveyance between such

colonies and Marseilles being by British packetboat, three pence each.

Newspapers between any of Her Majesty's colonies and British North America through the United Kingdom and also through the United States by the closed mail, via Marseilles, the sea conveyance between such colonies and Marseilles

being by British packet-boat, four pence each. British newspapers posted in the United Kingdom, addressed to Belgium, and sent to that country either direct or in closed mails, via France (the sea conveyance being by packet-boat),

Newspapers published in Belgium, and sent from thence to any part of the United Kingdom either direct or in closed mails, via France (the sea conveyance being by packet-boat), one half-

penny each.

And we direct, that every printed supplement or additional sheet to any newspaper shall, for the purpose of charging the postage under this war-rant, be deemed a distinct newspaper, unless sent in the same cover or together with the newspaper to which it is a supplement or addition.

And we direct; that he such printed newspaper shall be sent by the post at the rates aforesaid, unless the following conditions shall be observed:

First. Every such newspaper shall be sent without a cover, or in a band or cover open at the sides or ends.

Second. There shall be no word or communication printed on the newspaper after its publication, or upon the cover thereof, nor any writing or marks upon it, or upon the cover of it, except the name and address of the person to whom

Third. There shall be no paper or thing enclosed

in or with any such newspaper.

And in case any one of such conditions shall not be fulfilled, the whole paper or packet shall be charged with the letter rates of postage.

And we direct, that as to any packet authorized to be sent by the post under the provisions of a warrant under the hands of two of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated the second day of June one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and which shall be posted in Canada, or the Ionian Islands, and also as to any packet authorized to be sent by the post under the provisions of a warrant under the hands of two of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated the eleventh day of August one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one; and which shall be posted in Nova Scotia, the postage thereof shall, in every case, be prepaid either in money or by the proper colonial postage stamp or stamps being affixed thereto at the time of the same being posted; and if the postage of any such packet, posted in Canada, the Ionian Islands, or Nova Scotia, shall not be duly and properly prepaid in money or by colonial stamps when posted, the same shall and may be detained and opened at any place in the United Kingdom, and, at the option of the Postmaster-General, shall be either returned or given up to the sender thereof, or be given up to the person to whom it shall be addressed, or be forwarded to the place of its destination; and any such packet; on being so returned, given up, or forwarded, shall be chargeable with the like amount of postage to which it would have been liable as a letter.

And we further direct, that nothing herein contained shall be deemed of construed to annul. prejudice, or affect any of the exemptions and privileges granted by the said recited Act, or by any other Acts of Parliament relating to the Postoffice, and that all such exemptions and privileges shall remain in full force.

And we further direct, that the term "British West Indies," used in this warrant, shall include the Bermudas, Bahamas, and other British islands commonly called the West Indies, as also the colonies of British Guiana and Honduras, and their respective dependencies; and that the term "by the post," used in this warrant, shall, as to the sea conveyance, include the conveyance by packetboat; and that the several other terms and expressions used in this warrant, shall be construed to have the like meaning in all respects as they would have had if inserted in the said Act.

And we further direct, that this warrant, except so far as respects letters transmitted between any place in the United Kingdom and any port or place in the Danish colonies in the West Indies, and between any ports in such colonies, or between any of such colonies and any port in the British West Indies, or any port in Martinique, Guadaloupe, Venezuela, or New Granada, and between any of the Danish colonies in the West Indies and any port or place on the western coast of South America, shall come into operation on the day of the date hereof, and, as to such excepted letters, this warrant shall come into operation on the first day of July one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two.

Provided lastly, and we hereby declare and direct, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury, or any two of them, by warrant under their hands, at any time hereafter, to alter or repeal any of the rates hereby altered, or the regulations hereby made, and to make and establish any new or other rates or regulations in lieu thereof, and from time to time to appoint at what time the

rates that may be payable are to be paid.
