WE, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland, met in this General Assembly, beg leave to give utterance to our grateful sense of the warm satisfaction with which your Majesty has condescended to contemplate the approach of our present Meeting, and to express your assurance that our consultations will be guided by a due regard to the important interests committed to our charge, and to the maintenance and promotion of the peace and happiness of the Church of Scotland and the people at large.

Remembering also with heartfelt gratitude the many occasions on which former Assemblies have been assured of your Majesty's determination to maintain the Church of Scotland in the full possession of all its rights and privileges, we cannot fail to be encouraged by the unreserved confidence with which your Majesty has resolved to entrust the interests of this Church to our care, and to rely on the prudence and moderation which in your Majesty's estimation has long distinguished the deliberations of our predecessors, and we cherish the hope that your Majesty's favourable expectation may be fulfilled, that through the grace of the Almighty God we shall be guided into all the truth, so that our counsels and acts may be dictated by sound wisdom and discretion.

The **QUEEN's** Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for carrying into effect the reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled 'An Act for carrying into effect the reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the state of the Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to ecclesiastical duties and revenues, so far as they relate to episcopal dioceses, revenues, and patronage,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for making certain alterations in the apportionment of episcopal patronage.

"Whereas provision is made by the said Act for effecting, by the authority therein provided (that is to say, a scheme prepared by us and ratified by an Order of your Majesty in Council, and duly gazetted), such alterations in the apportionment or exchange of ecclesiastical patronage among the several bishops as shall be consistent with the relative magnitude and importance of their dioceses when newly arranged, and as shall afford an adequate quantity of patronage to the bishops of the new sees; but that no such alteration belonging to any see, the bishop of which was in possession on the fourth day of March one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, should take effect until the then next avoidance of such see, without the consent of such bishop.

"And whereas the bishops affected by this scheme, who were in possession of their sees on the said fourth day of March one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, have respectively consented as hereinafter mentioned to the arrangements herein recommended.

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James, Bishop of London, the Right Reverend James Henry, Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, the Right Reverend John, Bishop of Lincoln, and the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Rochester, testified by their having respectively signed and sealed this scheme, that such alterations be made in the apportionment or exchange of the patronage of the several benefices and churches among the several bishops, hereinafter mentioned, as are hereinafter particularly set forth and designated; that is to say:

"1. That the patronage of the several benefices comprised in the Table I., hereinafter set forth, and which said patronage is now vested in the Bishop of Ely, be transferred unto and henceforth be and remain vested in the Archbishop of Canterbury and his successors.

That, upon the next avoidance of the see of Winchester, the patronage of the vicarage of Newchurch with Ryde, in the Isle of Wight, in the diocese of Winchester, and which said patronage is now vested in the Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, shall be transferred unto and thenceforth be and remain vested in the Bishop of Winchester and his successors.

Limits of Port and Legal Quays.

WE, the undersigned, being two of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, do hereby, under the authority of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the ninth and tenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend the laws relating to the Customs," appoint Maldon to be a port in that part of the United Kingdom called England, and

we do hereby declare that the limits of the said port shall commence at the west entrance of Bilmerey Creek, near Tilbury Fort, in the county of Essex, and extend from thence to low-water mark in a direction south, towards a tree, or the site thereof, commonly called and known, and laid down in charts, as the Round Tree, in the parish of Milton-next-Gravesend, in the county of Kent, from thence along the shore at low-water mark, and the boundary of the port of London, across the mouths of the several creeks and inlets, to the west entrance of Holyhaven Creek, in the said county of Essex, from thence in a direct line along the boundary of the said port of London, to Shoeburyness Buoy, at the distance of one mile from Shoeburyness Point, from thence in a direct line along the boundary of the said port of London to the Shoe Beacon, on the south-east part of the Maplin Sands, from thence in a direct line along the boundary of the said port of London towards Saint Osyth's Point, in the said county of Essex, to the distance of one mile and a quarter from the said point, from thence in a direct line west-north-westwardly to Tollesbury Point (where the port of Colchester commences), and from the said point of Tollesbury westward to the town of Maldon, together with all bays, channels, roads, bars, strands, harbours, havens, rivers, streams, creeks, and places within the said limits contained.

And we, the said Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do hereby appoint the following places within the said port of Maldon, to be legal quays for the lading and unlading of goods, and do hereby declare the bounds and extent of the said quays to be as follows; that is to say:

All that open place, quay, or wharf, situate in the parish of St. Peter, Maldon, commonly called and known by the name of Sadd's Wharf, being in length along the river Chelmer sixty-seven feet, and in depth sixty-four feet, or thereabouts, bounded on the north-east by the said river Chelmer, on the north-west by Maldon Bridge or Full Bridge, on the south-east by land belonging to John Payne, and on the south-west by the cross-road leading to Payne's Limekiln.
