

Banbury, in the said counties and diocese, under the provisions of the said Act, by a scheme prepared by us, and ratified by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-third day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, and duly gazetted; and the boundaries of such district have since been altered by another scheme prepared by us, and ratified by an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the second day of February one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, and duly gazetted:

"And whereas no assignment of the right of patronage of the said district has yet been made, and the first nomination of a minister has been made by your Majesty:

"And whereas by a deed, bearing date the twelfth day of April one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, and duly executed and enrolled, all those the tithes, or tithe-commutation rent-charge or portions of tithe-commutation rent-charge issuing, arising, or payable out or in respect of the lands, tenements, and hereditaments within the said district of South Banbury, as now constituted by the said Schemes and Orders of your Majesty in Council, and also a certain piece or parcel of land situate within the said district, have been granted and conveyed to us by the Reverend William Wilson the younger, clerk, vicar of the vicarage of the said parish of Banbury, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, and of another Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled 'An Act to amend the Church Building Acts,' upon trust to be applied towards the permanent augmentation of the income of the minister of the said district, and, so soon as the same shall have become a new parish, of the perpetual curate thereof:

"And whereas the said William Wilson the younger has nominated to us the Bishop of Oxford for the time being as the patron in perpetuity of the said district or new parish, and has proposed to us that, in consideration of such grant and conveyance as aforesaid, the whole right of patronage of and nomination of the minister or perpetual curate to the said district or new parish shall be accordingly assigned to such bishop:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that the whole right of patronage of the said district or new parish of South Banbury, and the nomination of the minister or perpetual curate thereof, shall be assigned to and permanently vested in the Right Reverend Samuel, Bishop of Oxford, and his successors, bishops of Oxford, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the said district, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Oxford.
