WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England," and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the ninth day of September, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to carry into effect, with certain modifications, the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues,' and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England,' and of another Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to make better provision for the spiritual care of populous parishes,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for substituting a money payment to the prebendary of Stillington, in the cathedral church of York, for certain property belonging to him as such prebendary, and for authorising the sale of such property.

"Whereas by and under the provisions of the said Acts, the whole of the separate estates and endowments belonging to the said prebend (except any right of ecclesiastical patronage), will, upon the

first avoidance of the said prebend, become absolutely vested in us, for the purposes of the said Acts, and the chief of such purposes is the making of better provision for the cure of souls in parishes where such assistance is most required:

"And whereas it is by the said Acts enacted, that by the authority therein provided, and for the purpose of fully carrying into effect any of the provisions thereof, any arrangement may be made, from time to time, with the consent in writing under the hand of any prebendary of any cathedral church, for the sale, transfer, or exchange of any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments belonging to such prebendary, or for the purchase of other lands, tithes, or other hereditaments in lieu thereof, or for substituting, in any case, any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments for any money payment, or any money payment for any lands, tithes, or other hereditaments:

"And whereas it has been agreed between us and the Reverend Thomas Hutton Croft, the present holder of the said prebend, that with a view to sooner carrying into effect the purposes of the said recited Acts, hereinbefore particularly mentioned, the following arrangement should be recommended by us to your Majesty in Council:

"We, therefore, with the consent of the said Thomas Hutton Croft, testified by his having signed this scheme, humbly recommend and propose, that, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than a duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and upon and after the publication of such Order in the London Gazette, all lands, tithes, and other hereditaments whatsoever (except any right of ecclesiastical patronage) now belonging to the said Thomas Hutton Croft as such holder of the said prebend as aforesaid, or to or in which he has or ought to have any estate, right, title, or interest, shall, together with all such estate, right, title, and interest, therein (except as aforesaid) be, and be held to be, for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, transferred and conveyed by and from the said Thomas Hutton Croft, to us, and shall then and thereupon become and be absolutely vested in us for the purposes of the said Acts, subject only to any legally subsisting lease or leases thereof, or of any part or parts thereof; and that, in consideration of and for such transfer and conveyance, there shall be paid by us to the said Thomas Hutton Croft, the sum of five thousand eight hundred and eighty pounds, provided that no renewal of any lease, nor any new lease, of the said lands, tithes, or other hereditaments, or of any

part thereof, shall, since the seventeenth day of June last, have been or shall be granted or made by the said Thomas Hutton Croft.

"And whereas it is by the said thirdly recited Act (amongst other things) enacted, that notwithstanding the charge by that Act created (being a charge created in favour of the Governors of the bounty of Queen Anne), all the same and the like powers and rights of ownership as are possessed and enjoyed respecting and over any lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements, or other hereditaments whatsoever, by any absolute owner thereof, shall be enjoyed by us with respect to and over all or any lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements, or other hereditaments, vested in us under certain Acts therein mentioned (being the Acts under which the property hereinafter described is vested in us), and may, subject to the provisions of the same Acts and of the now reciting Act, be exercised by us, by proper instruments in writing, duly executed according to law, with a certain proviso respecting the application of every sum of money received as the consideration or purchase-money for the sale, transfer, or conveyance by us of any of such lands, tithes, tenements, or other hereditaments, or of any estate or interest therein, and with a further proviso that none of such lands, tithes, tenements, or other hereditaments be sold, transferred, or conveyed, except by the authority of a scheme, and an Order issued by your Majesty in Council ratifying the same :

"And whereas application has been made to us for the purchase of our estate and interest in certain portions of the said lands, tithes, tenements, and hereditaments, and after due consideration, it appears to us to be expedient that we should be empowered to dispose of our interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us to be advisable :

"We, therefore, further recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered, by instrument or instruments in writing, duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act, all or any of the said lands, tithes, tenements, hereditaments, or endowments, heretofore belonging to the said prebend of Stillington (except any right of ecclesiastical patronage), with their appurtenances, and all our estate, right, title, and interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same, and his or their heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall, upon due calculation and inquiry, appear to us to be just and reasonable.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct, that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of York.

"We, therefore, humbly recommend and pro-

pose, that we may be authorized and empowered, by instrument or instruments in writing, duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell, and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act, all or any of the said lands, tenements, hereditaments, or endowments, heretofore belonging to the said prebend of Barnby, otherwise Barmby-on-the-Moor, and so vested in us as aforesaid, with their appurtenances, and all our estate, right, title, and interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same, and his or their heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall, upon due calculation and inquiry, appear to us to be just and reasonable.

Passing Tolls Abolition.

(Ramsgate, Dover, Bridlington, Whitby, and other Harbours.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that in the ensuing session of Parliament it is intended to apply for leave to bring in a Bill to abolish all tolls, rates, or duties, now authorized to be levied for the construction or maintenance of any piers or harbours on the coast of England upon or in respect of vessels passing by but not entering within such piers or harbours, or upon or in respect of the cargoes on board of such vessels, and that it is intended in such Bill to amend or repeal the Acts following, or some or one of them; that is to say:

The Acts relating to the Royal Harbour of Ramsgate, viz. 32nd George 3rd, cap. 74; 37th George 3rd, cap. 86; and 55th George 3rd, cap. 84.

The Acts relating to Dover Harbour, viz. 9th George 4th, cap. 31; 6th and 7th William the 4th, cap. 125; and 11th and 12th Vict. cap. 97.

The Act relating to Bridlington Piers and Harbours, viz. 1 Vict. cap. 110.

And the Act relating to the piers and harbour of Whitby, viz. 7th and 8th George 4th, cap. 78.

And that it is intended in such Bill to alter and reduce, and from and after a day or days to be therein named, to repeal and abolish, all and every or some or one of the tolls, rates, or duties hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:

All tolls, rates, or duties payable for the main-

tenance, or in respect of Ramsgate Harbour, by the masters or owners of ships or vessels or crayers, passing by Ramsgate, or for coals, stones, goods, or merchandizes on board thereof.

All tolls, rates, or duties authorized to be levied in respect of Dover Harbour upon or for ships and vessels only passing by Dover, or upon or for coals, culm, or stone on board thereof.

All tolls, rates, or duties payable for the maintenance or in respect of Bridlington Harbour upon or in respect of coals conveyed in vessels past the port or harbour of Bridlington.

And all tolls, rates, or duties payable for the maintenance or in respect of Whitby Harbour, by the masters or owners of ships, loading or shipping coals at the port of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, or at Sunderland, Blyth, Seaton Sluice, Cullercoates, or any harbour, colliery, or place that is a member of the port of Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

And that it is intended by the said Bill, until the abolition of such rates and duties, to prescribe the application thereof, and to make provision for the maintenance of the said piers and harbours, and for the mortgage and other debts now secured upon the tolls, rates, and duties authorized by the said Acts to be raised and levied; and for that purpose to levy tolls, rates, or duties upon vessels entering within and using the said piers and harbours, and upon cargoes laden and discharged thereat; and to vary or extinguish existing exemptions from payment of tolls, rates, or duties in respect of such vessels or cargoes, and to confer other exemptions, rights, and privileges.

And that it is intended by the said Bill to vary or extinguish certain powers now enjoyed by the Trustees, Commissioners, or other persons appointed in and by or in pursuance of the said Acts for carrying the same into execution, and to vary or extinguish the rights and privileges of all Corporations, Commissioners, Trustees, or other persons mentioned or referred to in the said Acts, which it may be necessary for the purposes aforesaid to vary or extinguish, whether such rights or privileges be conferred by or held under charter, Act of Parliament, letters patent, or otherwise.—Dated this 27th day of October 1852.

Whitby Harbour.

(Repeal of powers as to passing Tolls, and amendment of Act.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that in the ensuing session of Parliament, it is intended to apply for leave to bring in a Bill to amend the Acts relating to the piers and harbour of the town and port of Whitby, in the county of York, and more particularly the Act 7th and 8th George the 4th, cap. 78, to alter the tolls, rates, and duties authorized to be levied by such Act, and the application thereof; to repeal and abolish at or from a time or times to be named in such Bill, all tolls, rates, and duties payable in respect of such piers and harbour, by virtue of such Act or otherwise, by the masters or owners of ships loading or shipping coals at the port of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, or at Sunderland, Blyth, Seaton Sluice, Cullercoates, or any harbour, colliery, or place, that is a member of the said port of Newcastle-upon-Tyne; to exempt such masters or owners from the future payment of such rates, tolls, and duties; to prescribe the application of such rates, tolls, and duties, until the same are abolished; to restrict the powers of the trustees under such Act to the levying of tolls, rates, and duties within the harbour; to vary or extinguish the rights and powers of such trustees; to make provision for the maintenance of the harbour out of the tolls, rates, and duties now levied upon vessels using the same, or

their cargoes, and, if necessary, to authorize further and other tolls to be levied for the use of such harbour.

Printed copies of such Bill will, on or before the 31st December next, be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons.

(For promoting Education in the boroughs of Manchester and Salford, and in the contiguous townships of Pendleton, Pendlebury, and Broughton, or some of them.)
