Notice to Persons going in the Procession.

The Persons who are to attend in the Procession in Carriages numbered 1 to 41, will enter the Park by Buckingham Gate, or Storey's Gate, *not later than Eight o'clock*, A. M. and proceed (through the Gate in the Railing near Storey's Gate) towards the Horse Guards, and will there be directed to Mourning Coaches of corresponding numbers in the line formed in numerical order in the open space and road.

All Carriages and Mourning Coaches numbered 42 to 67, will enter by the Horse Guards, *not later than Eight o'clock*, A. M. and turn to the Right, towards the Admiralty, and form in the numerical order indicated by the Card.

The Carriages which *precede* and those which *follow* the Funeral Car, will form in separate lines.
