The Lighthouse is placed in a depth of 9 feet water at low water, and is based on screw piles, forming, with the bracing, an open framing, coloured red. The superstructure in dwelling of octagonal form is coloured light grey.

The Light will be a fixed red light, elevated 32 feet over the level of high water, spring tides, and open to seaward and to the harbour, from S.S.W. ½ W. to N.W. b W. ½ W.

Masters of Vessels are cautioned not to cross the bank between the Lighthouse and Haulbowline Island, and to give the Lighthouse and the detached Beacon Pillar sufficient berth in passing.

After the 1st of March next, the floating light heretofore moored off the North East point of the bank, will be discontinued.
