The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the Session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to carry into effect, with certain "modifications, the fourth report of the Commis-"sioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the tenth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act ' to carry into effect, with certain modifications, ' the fourth report of the Commissioners of Eccle-' siastical Duties and Revenues,' have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for the sale of a certain rentcharge belonging to the Bishop of Llandaff in right of his see.

"Whereas the Right Reverend Alfred, Bishop of Llandaff, hath, with our concurrence, entered into an agreement with Frederick Romilly, of Eaton-terrace, in the county of Middlesex, Esquire, in the words and figures following; that is to say:


" 'Articles of agreement, made the eighth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, between the Right Reverend Alfred, Lord Bishop of Landaff, of the first part, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, of the second part, and Frederick Romilly, of Eaton-terrace, in the county of Middlesex, Esquire, of the third part.

"'Whereas by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament of the third and fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act "to carry into effect with certain modifications "the fourth report of the Commissioners of Eccle-"siastical Duties and Revenues," it was amongst other things enacted that, by the authority thereinafter provided, any arrangement might from time to time be made, with the consent in writing under the corporate seal of any Bishop, for the sale, transfer, or exchange of any lands, tithes, or

other hereditaments belonging to the see of such Bishop, or for the purchase of other lands, tithes, or other hereditaments in lieu thereof, or for substituting in any case any land, tithes, or other hereditaments for any money payment; and it was thereby enacted, that the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England should from time to time prepare and lay before Her Majesty in Council such schemes as should appear to the said Commissioners to be required, and to be best adapted for carrying the Act now in recital into full effect; and should in such schemes recommend and propose all such measures as might, upon further enquiry, which the said Commissioners were thereby authorized to make, appear to them to be necessary; and it was enacted, that when any such scheme should be approved by Her Majesty in Council, it should be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order or Orders ratifying the same, and specifying the time or times when such schemes should take effect; and it was further enacted, that every such Order should, as soon as might be after the making thereof by Her Ma-jesty in Council, be published in the London Gazette, and so soon as any Order in Council, made under the authority of the now reciting Act, should be so gazetted, it should in all respects, and as to all things therein contained, have and be of the same force and effect as if all and every part thereof were included in the now reciting Act ; and whereas a rent-charge or annual sum of forty-nine pounds, fourteen shillings, and five pence is payable to the Bishop of Llandaff and his successors, as part of the revenues of his sec, and is chargeable upon the manor of Llandaff, and other lands and hereditaments, belonging to the said Frederick Romilly and others, at and near Llandaff aforesaid; and whereas it being considered conducive to the efficiency of the established Church, within the purpose and meaning of the said recited Act, that the said rent-charge or annual sum of forty-nine pounds, fourteen shillings, and five pence should be sold, with a view to the purchase money for the same being invested in the purchase of lands and hereditaments, convenient to be held with and to be annexed to the said see, in lieu thereof an arrangement has been proposed by the said Bishop, and approved of by the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the sale thereof to the said Frederick Romilly for the sum of one thousand two hundred pounds, being the price at which the said rent-charge has been valued. by the surveyors of the Ecclesiastical Commis-Now these presents witness, that in sioners.

exercise and execution of the power and authority given by the hereinbefore recited Act of Parliament, and of every other power or authority in anywise in this behalf enabling, and with the con-sent of the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, testified by their execution hereof, he, the said Alfred, Lord Bishop of Llandaff, doth hereby agree to sell, and the said Frederick Romilly doth hereby agree to purchase, at or for the price of one thousand two hundred pounds, the fee simple and inheritance in posses-sion of and in all that the said rent-charge or annual sum of forty-nine pounds, fourteen shillings, and five pence, and all the right, title, and interest of the said Lord Bishop and his successors therein and thereto, free from all incumbrances created or occasioned by the said Lord Bishop, but subject to the land tax and to all other impositions and obligations now legally charged thereon ; and it is hereby further agreed as follows; that is to say : that the said sum of one thousand two hundred pounds shall be paid to the said Ecclesiatical Commissioners, and shall be applied by them, with the consent of the said Bishop, as soon as conveniently may be, in the purchase of freehold lands, tenements, and hereditaments convenient to be held with the episcopal residence and estates now belonging to the said see of Llandaff, or with any part thereof. That the said Frederick Romilly shall not require or be entitled to any evidence of the title of the said Lord Bishop to the said rentcharge, such title being admitted; and that this agreement, and every thing herein contained, shall be subject to the approval of Her Majesty in Council. And the said Commissioners hereby agree forthwith to prepare and lay before Her Majesty in Council a scheme recommending and proposing that Her Majesty should approve and ratify the same accordingly, and should order and direct that the same shall take effect, and that the said rent-charge shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than any Order to be made by Her Majesty in Council ratifying such scheme, be transferred to and vested absolutely in the said Frederick Romilly, his heirs and assigns, subject as aforesaid immediately after any such Order in Council shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, and after the said Frederick Romilly shall have paid to the Treasurers of the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners the said sum of one thousand two hundred pounds.

" 'In witness whereof the said Lord Bishop hath hereunto set his hand and episcopal seal, and the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners have hereunto set their common seal, and the said Frederick Romilly hath hereunto set his hand and seal the day and year first above written.



"Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose, that the said agreement be approved and ratified by your Majesty in Council, so that the same shall take effect, and that the said rent-charge shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than any order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, be transferred to and vested absolutely in the said Frederick Romilly, his heirs and assigns, immediately after any such Order in Council shall have been duly gazetted, and after the said Frederick Romilly shall have paid to our treasurers the sum of twelve hundred pounds.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Acts, or any or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Llandaff.

And also to command that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of postage," power is given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, by warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British postage, or inland postage payable by . law on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters or newspapers, or of any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof, and a . scale of weight to be contained in such warrant, and from time to time, by warrant as aforesaid, to alter or repeal any such altered rates, and make and establish any new or other rates in lieu thereof, and, from time to time, by warrant as aforesaid, to appoint at what time the rates which may be payable are to be paid; and it is provided that the power thereby given should extend to any increase or reduction or remission of postage.

And whereas, in consequence of a communication opened with the Government of Brazil, it is considered expedient to alter the rates of postage payable on the letters hereinafter mentioned.

Now we, the undersigned, being two of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do, in exercise of the power or authority in us for such purpose vested in and by the said recited Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling

us in this behalf, direct, that on every letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight, transmitted by the post between any part of the United Kingdom and any port in Brazil, conveyed between the United Kingdom and Brazil direct by packetboat, there shall be charged and taken, in lieu of any rates of British postage now payable by law on such letters, an uniform rate of British postage of one shilling; and that on every letter, not exceeding half an ounce in weight, transmitted by the post between any two ports in Brazil direct by packet-boat, without passing through the United Kingdom, there shall be charged and taken in lieu of any rates of British postage, now payable by law on such letters, an uniform rate of British postage of three pence half-penny.

And we direct, that on every letter, not exceeding half an ounce in weight, transmitted by the post between Brazil and any of Her Majesty's colonies or any foreign country through the United Kingdom, conveyed direct by packet-boat or private ship, between the United Kingdom and Brazil, there shall be charged and taken, in lieu of any rates of British postage now payable by law on such letters if conveyed between the United Kingdom and Brazil nited Kingdom and Brazil an uniform rate of British by packet-boat, postage of one shilling, for the conveyance of every such letter between Brazil and any part of the United Kingdom; and if by private ship, an uniform rate of British postage of eight-pence, for the conveyance of any such letter between Brazil and any part of the United Kingdom; and there shall be also charged on all such letters, whether conveyed by packet-boat or private ship, such a further or additional rate of British postage for the conveyance of every such letter between the port in the United Kingdom of the departure or arrival of the packet or ship conveying the same, and the colony or foreign country to or from which the same shall be forwarded, as shall from time to time be charged and payable for British postage on letters not exceeding half an ounce in weight, posted or delivered at the port in the United Kingdom of the departure or arrival of the packet or ship conveying the same, and transmitted direct between such port and such colony or foreign country.

And we further direct, that on every letter transmitted as hereinbefore in this warrant is mentioned; exceeding half an ounce in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid, progressive and additional rates of postage as follows; that is to say:

- On every letter exceeding half an ounce in weight, and not exceeding one ounce in weight, two rates of postage.
- . On every letter exceeding one ounce, and not exceeding two ounces in weight, four rates of postage.
- On every letter exceeding two ounces, and not exceeding three ounces in weight, six rates of postage.
- And on every letter exceeding three ounces, and not exceeding four ounces in weight, leight rates of postage.
- And for every ounce in weight above the weight of four ounces, there shall be charged and taken two additional rates of postage; and every fraction of an ounce above the weight of four ounces, shall be charged as one additional ounce; and each progressive and additional rate chargeable under this clause, shall be estimated and charged at the sum which any such letter would be charged with

under this warrant; if not exceeding half an

ounce in weight.

And we direct that the letters and dispatches of the Government of Brazil to or from its diplomatic agents in London, Lisbon, Monte Video and Buenos Ayres, forwarded by British packetboat, shall be conveyed free of all charge of British postage, provided that this privilege shall be confined to letters and dispatches received from or addressed to the Government of Brazil, by the Brazilian Minister in London, or by the Brazilian Minister or Brazilian Consul in Lisbon, Monte Video, or Buenos Ayres respectively; provided also that the weight of such letters and dispatches sent by any one packet-boat to or from the Brazilian Minister in London, shall not exceed one hundred and twenty ounces, and that the weight of such letters and dispatches, sent by any one packet-boat, to or from the Brazilian Minister or Consul in Lisbon, Monte Video, or Buenos Ayres shall not exceed thirty ounces; and that if such letters and dispatches, by any one packet-boat, to or from the Brazilian Minister in London, shall exceed the weight of one hundred and twenty ounces, or if such letters and dispatches, by any one packet-boat, to or from the Brazilian Minister or Consul in Lisbon, Monte Video, or Buenos Ayres shall exceed the weight of thirty ounces, the excess above one hundred and twenty ounces and thirty ounces respectively shall be charged with the like rates of postage as would, under this warrant, be chargeable if such letters and dispatches had not been sent to or from any such privileged person; provided also, that all such letters and dispatches, to be entitled to be conveyed free of postage, if sent from London, shall bear the official seal of the Brazilian Minister in London, and shall be addressed to the Minister of Foreign Affairs at Rio de Janeiro, and if sent from Lisbon, Monte Video, and Buenos Ayres the same shall bear the official seal of the Brazilian Minister or Brazilian Consul in Lisbon, Monte Video, or Buenos Ayres respectively, and shall be addressed to the Minister of Foreign Affairs at Rio de Janeiro, and all such letters and dispatches, if sent from Brazil, shall bear the official seal of such Minister of Foreign Affairs.

And we direct that the letters and dispatches to and from the Government of Brazil may be sent by British packet-boat between any ports in Brazil at which such packet-boats may touch free of all charge of British postage.

And we further direct that nothing herein contained shall be deemed or construed to annul, prejudice, or affect any of the exemptions and privileges granted by the said recited Act, or by an Act made and passed in the first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the management of the Post-office," and that all such exemptions and privileges shall remain in full force.

And we further direct that the terms and expressions used in this warrant shall be construed to have the like meaning in all respects as they would have had if inserted in the said Act of the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty; and that the term packet-boat, used in this warrant, shall include any ship or vessel freighted or maintained by or by order of Her Majesty's Government.

And we further direct that this warrant shall come into operation on the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three.

Provided, lastly, and we hereby declare and direct that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury, or any two of them, by warrant under their hands, at any time hereafter, to alter or repeal any of the lane, London.
