

Whitehall, March 28, 1853.

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto John Sherburne Sherburne (heretofore John Sherburne Tench), late of the Wilderness, Hampton Wick, in the parish of Hampton, in the county of Middlesex, but now of Park-place, Finchley, in the same county, Gentleman, Her Royal Licence and authority, that he may continue to use the surname of Sherburne, in lieu of that of Tench, and that he may also bear the arms of Sherburne, and that such surname and arms may in like manner be taken, borne, and used by his issue, the said arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office, otherwise the said licence and permission to be void and of none effect.

And also to command that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

Hull and Holderness Railway.

NOTICE is hereby given, that a Bill is now pending in the Honourable the House of Commons, intituled "A Bill to incorporate a Company for making a railway from Kingston-upon-Hull to or near to Withernsea-in-Holderness, with a branch therefrom, and for other purposes," and that application is intended to be made to Parliament for leave to make an alteration in the course of the main line of the said intended railway, as shewn on the plans deposited, in pursuance of the Standing Orders of Parliament, in the month of November last; such alteration to commence in a field numbered 18 on the said plans, in the township of Winestead, and parish of Winestead, thence to pass in, through, or into the parish and township of Patrington; thence in, through, or into the parish and township of Winestead aforesaid; thence in, through, or into the said parish and township of Patrington, and to terminate in a field numbered 12 on the said plans, in the township of Patrington, and parish of Patrington aforesaid; and, for the purpose of effecting such alteration to make a deviation in the course of a certain drain, called Winestead Level Drain, in the said townships of Winestead and Patrington, to the extent which will be defined on the plans to be deposited as hereinafter mentioned.

And notice is hereby further given, that a plan and section of the said intended alteration in the line of the said railway, and of the said deviation

of Winestead Level Drain, with a book of reference thereto, will, together with a copy of this notice as published in the London Gazette, be deposited, on or before the thirty-first day of March in the present year, with the Clerk of the Peace for the East Riding of the county of York, at his office, in Beverley, in the said Riding; and also with the Clerk of the Peace for the town or borough of Kingston-upon-Hull, and county of the same town or borough, at his office, No. 23, Bishop-lane, in the said borough of Kingston-upon-Hull; and that, on or before the same day, a copy of so much of the said plan and section, and book of reference as relates to each of the parishes in or through which the said alteration is proposed to be made, will, together with a copy of this notice, be deposited with the parish clerk of each such parish, at his residence.
