NOTICE is hereby given, that his Royal Highness Prince Albert will, by the desire of Her Majesty, hold a Levee at St. James's-Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Wednesday, the 27th instant, at two o'clock.

It is Her Majesty's pleasure that presentations to His Royal Highness at the Levee shall be considered equivalent to presentations to the Queen.

Addresses to the Queen may either be forwarded to Her Majesty through the Secretary of State for the Home Department, or may be reserved until Her Majesty shall hold a Levee.

## REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE LEVEE AT ST. JAMES'S-PALACE.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who purpose to attend the Levee, at St. James's-Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance in the Presence-chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name.

Those Gentlemen who are to be presented are hereby informed, it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to present them, should be delivered at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, *before twelve o'clock, on the Monday previous* to the Levee, in order that they may be submitted for approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall be made at the Levees but in conformity with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of Company coming to Court, until half-past one o'clock.
