

Ecclesall Bierlow Union.—Nether Hallam Township.

To the Overseers of the Poor of the township of Nether Hallam, in the county of York ;—
To the Clerk or Clerks to the Justices of the Petty Sessions held for the division or divisions in which the said township is situate ;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the township of Nether Hallam, in the county of York, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons : And whereas, at a meeting of the Vestry of the said township, held at Crooksmoor Workhouse, after public notice in that behalf, on Tuesday the eleventh day of January last, it was resolved,—

“ That the Poor Law Board be requested to
“ issue an Order under their seal of office
“ directing that the Act, passed on the 5th
“ August, 1850 (13th and 14th Vict., c. 57),
“ entitled ‘ An Act to prevent the holding of
“ vestry or other meetings in churches, and
“ for regulating the appointment of vestry
“ clerks,’ shall be applied to and put in
“ force within this township as regards that
“ portion of it which relates to the pro-
“ viding of accommodation for holding vestry
“ meetings.”

And whereas, there being no Churchwardens of the said township, the Overseers thereof have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above resolution.

Now, therefore, we, the said Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, do hereby order and direct :

ART. 1. That so much of the aforesaid Act, as relates to the providing of a room for the purpose of holding any Vestry and other meetings for the transaction of any business of or relating to the said township of Nether Hallam, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said township.

ART. 2. That a copy of this order shall be published in the London Gazette.

Jesus College (Cambridge) Estate Act.

Powers to enable the Master (or Keeper), Fellows, and Scholars of Jesus College, in the University of Cambridge, to alter and vary the mode of dealing with the Benefaction of Dr. Edmund Proby and Sir Thomas Proby, and to appropriate the same for the benefit of the said College, in erecting or providing Parsonage Houses for Livings belonging to the said College, and in augmenting such Livings, and for other purposes, including the repeal of existing legislative enactments relating to the said Benefaction.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made in the present session of Parliament for an Act to enable the Master (or Keeper), Fellows, and Scholars of the College of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint John the Evangelist, and the Glorious Virgin Saint Rhadegund (commonly called Jesus College), in the University of Cambridge, to alter and vary the mode of dealing with the Benefaction of Doctor Edmund Proby and Sir Thomas Proby, and to appropriate the same, and the accumulations thereof for the

benefit of the said College, in erecting or providing Parsonage Houses for each or any of the following livings, belonging to the said College (to wit) : the Rectories of Harlton and Gravely, in the county of Cambridge, the Vicarage of Elmstead, in the county of Essex, and the Vicarages of Swavesey, Whittlesford, Guilden Morden, Hinxton, Comberton, and Fordham, all in the county of Cambridge; Tewing, in the county of Herts; and King's Stanley, in the county of Gloucester; the Vicarages of All Saints and Saint Clements, in the town of Cambridge, and the Vicarage of Hundon, in the county of Suffolk; and in augmenting such livings, or some of them, and for the avoidance of the Fellowship of the Fellows of the said College, to be presented to certain of the said Livings when augmented, and for other purposes, including the repeal of an existing Act, passed in the second year of the reign of King William the Fourth, relating to the said Benefaction (except so far as such last-mentioned Act repeals a former Act, passed in the third year of the reign of King George the Third, relating to such Benefaction), and also the repeal of such part of the last-mentioned Act (being a provision for the avoidance of the Fellowship of the Fellows of the said College, to be presented to the said Rectories of Harlton and Gravely, and the said Vicarage of Elmstead), as was not repealed by the said Act of the second year of King William the Fourth.—Dated this 13th day of April, 1853.
