Those Ladies who are to be presented are hereby informed, that it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the names of the Ladies who are to present them, should be delivered at the Lord Chamberlain's Office on Tuesday the 31st of May for the first Drawing-Room; on Saturday the 11th of June for the second Drawing-Room; and on Tuesday the 21st of June for the third Drawing-Room, on each day, before twelve o'clock, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation; it being Her Majesty's command, that no presentation shall take place, unless the name of the Lady presenting, together with that of the Lady to be presented, shall appear on the card to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, which names shall correspond with those previously sent in to the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Legal Quay.

WE, the undersigned, Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, do hereby, under the authority of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the ninth and tenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to amend the laws relating to the Customs," appoint the following place, within the port of Plymouth, to be a legal quay for the lading and unlading of goods; and we do hereby declare the extent of the said quay to be as follows; that is to say: all that floating pier or wharf, at Plymouth, commonly called or known as the Pontoon, situate at Mill-bay, in the parish of Saint Andrew, and county of Devon, being in length from east to west three hundred feet, and in breadth forty feet, or thereabouts, and connected by a bridge two hundred and fifty feet long, with the Pier Wharf, already legalized.

South Eastern Railway.—Strood to Maidstone.

Alteration of Line during progress of Bill. WHEREAS a Bill is now pending in Parliament, intituled a Bill to enable the South Eastern Railway Company, to make a railway from Strood to Maidstone, and for other purposes; and whereas during the progress of the said Bill, and since the deposit of the plans and sections therein referred to, which plans and sections were deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Kent, at his office at Maidstone, in the month of November, in the year 1852, it has been found expedient that the railway by the said Bill intended to be authorized should, between the points on the line of such railway, in the parishes of Ditton and Aylesford, hereinafter mentioned, be constructed according to a different line from that delineated upon the said plans deposited as aforesaid. Now notice is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present session, to insert in the said Bill all necessary and proper provisions for enabling the South-Eastern Railway Company to construct the railway by the said Bill proposed to be authorized between the property numbered 2, jr of Ditton, on the said plans deposit

and the property numbered 19, in the parish of Aylesford, on the said plans, by a line situate wholly in the parishes of Ditton and Aylesford, but differing in its course and direction from that delineated upon the said plans, between the said properties numbered as aforesaid thereon.

And it is proposed to insert in the said Bill, powers to take lands and buildings by compulsion or agreement for the purposes of the said altered portion of railway, and to vary or extinguish all existing rights or privileges in any manner connected with such lands and buildings, or which would in any manner impede or interfere with the construction or maintenance thereof.

And it is also proposed to insert in the said Bill, powers to stop up, alter, or divert all such turnpike or other roads and highways or streams, within the parish of Aylesford, as it may be necessary to stop up, alter, or divert, by reason of the construction of the said railway according to the altered line hereinbefore mentioned, and

especially it is intended to alter and divert the public carriage road, numbered respectively 40 and 52 in the parish of Aylesford, on the plans deposited as aforesaid.

And it is proposed by the said Bill to take power to levy tolls for the use of the said altered

portion of railway.

And notice is also hereby given, that plans and sections, describing the direction line and levels of the said intended altered portion of railway, and the lands through which the same is intended to be made, together with a book of reference to such plans, and a copy of this notice have been, in this present month of May, deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Kent, at his office at Maidstone, and with the respective clerks of the parishes of Ditton and Aylesford, at their places of abode respectively.
