REGISTRY OF COUNTY COURTS' JUDGMENTS.

IN pursuance of the Act, 15 and 16 Vict., c. 54, relating to proceedings in the County Courts, the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury (with the view of affording to traders a ready means of ascertaining the solvency of parties, and to enable executors and administrators to discover what judgment debts they are bound to satisfy), have established an Office at No. 1, Parliament-street, Westminster, wherein the name, address, and occupation of every party against whom a judgment has been recorded since March, 1847, in any of the County Courts throughout England and Wales, for £10, and upwards, and which remains unsatisfied, has been registered; and wherein also the name, &c., of every party against whom a judgment may hereafter be obtained in the said Courts, will be immediately registered.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Matlock, in the county of Derby, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons:

And whereas, at a meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held, after a public notice in that behalf, on Thursday the twenty-fourth day of March last, it was resolved,—

“That the Churchwardens make application to the Poor Law Commissioners praying them to make an Order for the appointment of a Vestry Clerk for this parish, under the Vestry and Vestry Clerk Act of 13th and 14th Vict., c. 57, for the appointment and payment of Vestry Clerks.”

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said

parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above resolution.

Now, therefore, we, the said Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, do hereby order and direct:

ART. 1. That so much of the said Act, passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, as relates to the appointment of a vestry clerk, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Matlock.

ART. 2. That a copy of this order shall be published in the London Gazette.

Alteration of line during progress of Bill.

WHEREAS a Bill is now pending in Parliament, intituled “A Bill to enable the London and North Western Railway Company to construct a railway from near Tring to Oxford, with a branch at Oxford, and for other purposes;” and whereas during the progress of the said Bill, and since the deposit of the plans and sections therein referred to, which plans and sections were deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Oxford, at his office, in Oxford, in the month of November, in the year 1852, it has been found expedient with a view to meet the requirements of the committee of the House of Commons to whom the said Bill was referred for the protection of the Oxford Observatory, that the railway by the said Bill intended to be authorised should, between the points on the line of such
