WHEREAS the population of the parish of Gravesend, in the county of Kent, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons:

And whereas at a meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held at the vestry-room of the church, after a public notice in that behalf, on Thursday, the seventeenth day of March last, it was resolved,—

“That the Poor Law Board be requested to issue an Order, under their Seal of Office, directing that the Act passed on the 5th August, 1850 (13 and 14 Vict., c. 57), entitled ‘An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the appointment of Vestry Clerks,’ shall be applied to and put in force within this parish, as regards that portion of it only which relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk.”

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above resolution.

Now, therefore, we, the said Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, do hereby order and direct:

ART. 1. That so-much of the said Act, passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within the said parish of Gravesend.

ART. 2. That a copy of this order shall be published in the London Gazette.
