And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch, in the county of Middlesex, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons:

And whereas at a meeting of the Vestry of the

said parish, held at the vestry-room in the said parish, after a public notice in that behalf, on Thursday, the seventeenth day of February last, and continued by adjournment and poll to the twenty-third day of February last, it was resolved,—

“That this Public Vestry does hereby adopt
“for the government of this parish an Act
“passed in the Session of Parliament held in
“the 13th and 14th years of Her present
“Majesty, intituled ‘An Act to prevent the
“holding of Vestry or other Meetings in
“Churches, and for regulating the appoint-
“ment of Vestry Clerks,’ and this Vestry
“doth therefore now authorize the Church-
“wardens to make the necessary application
“to the Commissioners for administering the
“laws for relief of the Poor in England for
“an Order, under their Seal of Office, to
“have the said Act 13th and 14th Vic. cap.
“57., intituled ‘An Act to prevent the
“holding of Vestry or other Meetings in
“Churches, and for regulating the appoint-
“ment of Vestry Clerks,’ applied to and be
“put in force within this Parish.”

And whereas at another meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held in the Vestry Room, after public notice in that behalf, on the ninth day of June last, it was (amongst other things) resolved,—

“That the person who may be elected to the
“office of Vestry Clerk shall be required to
“give security to the amount of £300 for
“his fidelity.
“That it will suit the convenience of this
“Vestry that the Poor Law Board should
“issue a separate Order for the appointment
“of a Vestry Clerk.”

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the said resolutions passed at the said last-mentioned meeting of the said Vestry.

Now, therefore, we, the Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, do hereby order and direct:

ART. 1. That so much of the said Act, passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within the said parish of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch.

ART. 2. That every person appointed to the office of Vestry Clerk in the said parish, shall give to the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish, a bond, in the penal sum of three hundred pounds, in the names of himself and two sufficient sureties, conditioned for the due and faithful performance of the duties of the office; and every such officer shall give immediate notice to the said Churchwardens and Overseers, of the death, insolvency, or bankruptcy of either of such sureties, and shall, when required by the said Churchwardens and Overseers, produce a certificate, signed by two householders, that his sureties are alive and believed by them to be solvent, and shall supply a fresh surety in the place of any such surety who may die, or become bankrupt or insolvent.

Provided that the said Churchwardens and Overseers may, if they think fit, take the security of any society or company expressly authorized by statute to guarantee or secure the faithful discharge of the duties of any Poor Law officer.

ART. 3. That a copy of this order shall be published in the London Gazette.
