NOTICE

Relating to the lighting of Hvitingsæ Light.

In conformity with the Department's notice of the 2nd December last year, notice is hereby given, that the light on Hvitingsæ, in the vicinity of Stavanger, having undergone the alterations therein pointed out, will be re-lighted on the evening of the 1st October next, at the same time as the other lights in the Kingdom, and will continue to burn as they do.

The Hvitingsœ Light will therefore in future be a fixed light, varied with a flash every 4th minute, of the second order (Fresnel's system). The height of the light above the sea is 145 Norwegian feet (149 English); the light is visible from 20 to 22 English miles, longitude east of Greenwich 5° 25′ 0", latitude north 59° 4′ 0".

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, copies of despatches from Her Majesty's Consuls at Naples, Rome, Bilbao, and Barcelona, reporting that in consequence of the existence of Asiatic Cholera in Great Britain the following Quarantine Regulations have been adopted in their respective ports:

At Naples, all vessels from London and Newcastle are to be subjected to ten days' quarantine at Nisita; and from all other ports of Great Britain to seven days.

The Roman Government has subjected to a quarantine of twelve days all vessels arriving from British ports, and their merchandize to twenty-

At Bilbao the Board of Health of Biscay has ordered that all vessels arriving from London are to proceed to Vigo, to perform quarantine.

At Barcelona, all vessels arriving from Great Britain will be subject to a quarantine of observation of five days, which will be increased to seven days when coming from places where cholera is known to exist.

And Her Majesty has been further pleased to command that the said royal order and declaration be registered in Her College of Arms.
