THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, copies of Despatches from Her Majesty's Consuls at Charente and Naples, reporting the following Quarantine Regulations, in consequence of the existence of Asiatic cholera in Great Britain :

The Board of Health of Rochefort has ordered that all vessels arriving at Charente, from British ports and the Baltic, without clean bills of health, shall perform a quarantine of 5 days at the Isle of Aix ; and those that have any sickness on board shall be sent to Trompeloup, in the Gironde, where they will be subject to the rules of that lazaretto. Vessels having clean bills of health, and no sickness on board, will be admitted to entry on arrival.

At Naples the term of quarantine has been increased from 7 to 10 days on all the vessels arriving from the ports of Great Britain.

By Decree of the Governor-General of Netherlands India, dated 17th July, 1853, it is provided :

- a. That the resident of Rio shall be allowed to grant license to foreigners to settle for the purposes of trade in that port, until counter-ordered.

- b. That the residents of Rio and of Menado shall not have the faculty of rescinding a license of settlement once granted, either for Rio, or Menado, or Kema, excepting for reasons of overruling necessity, and with the special sanction of the Governor-General.

- c. That the residents of Rio and Menado shall be authorized to allow traders holding a license of temporary residence, either for Rio, or Menado, or Kema, likewise until countermanded, to stay at the principal places in the districts of said residences, subjecting themselves to every local stipulation and instruction which may be issued in regard to them.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

IN conformity with the notice given by this Board, on the 12th ultimo, further notice is hereby given that the light-vessel on the Copper Shoal (Kobber Gründ) had been laid at her station, in four fathoms water, and the lights were shewn for the first time on the night of the 24th to 25th instant.

The vessel's three lights consist of three single sideral lanterns, of which two are fixed on the after part of the fore or highest mast, respectively 50 and 25 feet above the level of the water, and the third on the fore part of the main or shortest mast, 40 feet above the level of the water. The lights will be kept burning the same time as all other lights in the Kingdom ; viz. : from one half hour after sunset until its rise.

It lights the horizon for a distance of nine miles, English (two miles, Danish).

DIRECTIONS AND REGULATIONS OF THE GENERAL BOARD OF HEALTH,
Issued under Authority of the Nuisances Removal and Diseases Prevention Act, 1848, Section X.

To Local Boards of Health acting under the Public Health Act, 1848;

To Town Councils or other Bodies acting under the Authority of Local Acts of Parliament in which the Provisions of the Public Health Act are included;

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions in England and Wales, named in the First and Third Schedules hereunto annexed;

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Parishes in England and Wales, named in the Second Schedule hereunto annexed;

To the Overseers of the Poor of all Parishes, Townships, and Places not comprised in the Unions and Parishes mentioned in the Schedules hereunto annexed;

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of Cities and Boroughs, Commissioners under Local Acts, the Surveyors of Highways, their Deputies and Assistants, Road Trustees, Commissioners, County Surveyors, and other Persons by Law intrusted with the Care and Management of all Streets, public Ways and Places in any Parish or Place in England and Wales;

To the Owners and Occupiers of Houses, Dwellings, Churches, Buildings, and places of Assembly within the said Unions and Parishes, and others having the Care and Ordering thereof;

And to all whom it may concern;—

WHEREAS Directions and Regulations, bearing date the 20th day of September, 1853, were issued by Us, the General Board of Health, according to the provisions of "The Nuisances Removal and Diseases Prevention Act, 1848," acting under an Order of the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, bearing date the 15th day of September, 1853:

And whereas doubts have arisen in relation to those of the said Directions numbered respectively 9 and 10 in the copies thereof printed by the Queen's Printers; and it is expedient to remove the same and to make other Regulations in place thereof:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the Authority vested in us as aforesaid, We, the General Board of Health, do hereby, from and after the expiration of one week from the date hereof, revoke the Regulations and Directions, numbered respectively 9 and 10, above referred to, and from and after such period:

We direct,

1. That when any dwelling-house in any place to which these Directions and Regulations extend is in such a filthy and unwholesome condition as to be a nuisance or injurious to health; or,

Where upon, adjoining to, or near any premises or place as aforesaid there is any drain, ditch, gutter, watercourse, privy, cesspool, or ashpit kept or constructed so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health; or,

Where upon, adjoining to, or near any such premises or place, swine or any other animal, or any accumulation of dung, manure, offal, filth, refuse, or other matter or thing, shall be kept so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health:

Then the owner or occupier, or the person

having the care of such dwelling-house or premises, or the person causing the nuisance aforesaid, shall forthwith cleanse, whitewash, ventilate, or otherwise purify, as the case may require, such dwelling-house or premises, or otherwise abate or remove the nuisance or matter injurious to health as aforesaid.

And if default be made herein by reason of the poverty of the owner, occupier, or other person or otherwise, and complaint shall have been made as hereinafter provided,

The Local Authority empowered to act in the place where the premises complained of shall be situate,

Or, if there shall be no such Local Authority, or the Local Authority shall delay for an unreasonable time, the Guardians of the Union or Parish, or the Overseers respectively, shall forthwith take all proper means for carrying into effect the Directions above prescribed for the owner or occupier.

2. Complaint as to any of the matters in the preceding Direction may be made to the Board of Guardians and Overseers respectively, or to the Local Authority of the Union, Parish, or Place wherein the matter of complaint exists; and the Board of Guardians or Overseers respectively, on receipt of such complaint, shall either cause proceedings to be taken under the first section of the Nuisances Removal and Diseases Prevention Act, 1848, or forward the complaint to such Local Authority, who shall proceed thereon forthwith; unless where there has been previous default on the part of such Local Authority, when the Board of Guardians or Overseers shall themselves forthwith, if necessary, act on the complaint as above directed.

3. That the Guardians of any Union or Parish, or the Overseers respectively, if they deem it necessary by reason of the appearance or reasonable apprehension of cholera in such Union or Parish, shall cause any such dwelling-house or premises to be cleansed and purified, and any such nuisance or matter injurious to health, as herein-before described, to be forthwith removed and abated, without any previous complaint being made to them or to the Local Authority.

4. That where any Medical Officer engaged in carrying our Regulations into execution shall certify in writing that any dwelling-house or room is so overcrowded as to threaten danger to the health of the inmates on the occurrence of cholera or any epidemic disease, and shall specify in such certificate the number of inmates which shall not be exceeded in such house or room, the owner or occupier having the control of such house or room shall forthwith reduce the number of inmates as specified in such certificate, notwithstanding any measures may have been taken to ventilate, purify, or cleanse the house or room.

5. That the Provisions of the Common Lodging Houses Act, shall extend to rooms occupied by members of different families, whether for weekly, monthly, quarterly, or longer periods.

6. The expression Local Authority used herein shall signify the Town Council, Local Board of Health, or any Trustees or Commissioners for the draining, paving, lighting, cleansing, managing, or directing the police of any town, borough, or place, or any other

body of a like nature, or any Commissioners of Sewers, or any body, excepting Boards of Guardians and Overseers, having by law powers for the removal of nuisances; and the other words used shall be herein interpreted as in our Regulations and Directions dated the 20th of September last.

**DIRECTIONS AND REGULATIONS OF
THE GENERAL BOARD OF HEALTH,
Issued under Authority of the Nuisances
Removal and Diseases Prevention Act, 1848,
Section X.**

*To Officers of the Customs and Coast Guard,
Medical Officers of Quarantine, Union
and Parochial Medical Officers, and
Pilots;*

*To Persons in Command of Merchant Ships
arriving at Ports in England and Wales;
And to all whom it may concern:—*

WHEREAS by the provisions of "The Nuisances Removal and Diseases Prevention Act, 1848," for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases, we, the General Board of Health, are authorized to issue such directions and regulations as we shall think fit, for the prevention, as far as possible, or mitigation of epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease. And whereas by the said Act it is provided, that the directions and regulations to be issued as aforesaid shall extend to all parts or places in which the said provisions of the said Act shall, for the time being, be in force under the Order of Her Majesty's Privy Council, unless such directions or regulations shall be expressly confined to some of such parts or places, and then to such parts or places as in such directions and regulations shall be specified;

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, bearing date the 15th day of September, 1853, the said provisions of the said Act were directed to be put in force throughout the whole of Great Britain for a period of six calendar months thence next ensuing:

Now, in exercise of the authority vested in us as aforesaid, we, the General Board of Health, do issue the directions and regulations hereinafter contained, to extend to all vessels arriving in ports, harbours, rivers, creeks, or roads throughout England and Wales, that is to say:

I. That in every case when a vessel arrives in port, the captain shall report to the Customs officer (whether inspector or surveyor,) who first comes on board, or to the officer of the Coast-guard, as the case may be, or to the pilot, the number of persons on board, whether passengers or seamen, who from illness, from whatsoever cause, are unable to stand or to work.

II. That the said Customs officer shall see such persons, and if upon inquiry the illness, from whatsoever cause, be such that there is reasonable ground for desiring medical advice, or if such advice be desired by the person suffering, then such officer shall send notice thereof to the nearest union or parochial medical officer, or to any medical practitioner who may have been specially appointed to act as officer of quarantine.

III. That for the purpose of sending such notification, the captain shall provide a boat and men, as he may be requested, to convey the notice, and to bring back such medical officer to examine the case or cases of sickness on board.

IV. Where the Customs or Coast-guard officer cannot consistently with his duty quit the ship, then he shall require the officer in command of the ship to send the last-mentioned notice, and shall note in his official book the date and hour of his having done so; and in case the officer in command of the ship refuse or fail to send such notice, the Custom House officer shall report the fact to the first visiting officer by whom the vessel may be boarded, that proceedings may be taken against the commanding officer according to law for wilful neglect of the directions of the General Board of Health.

V. Where there is no medical officer of quarantine, the principal offices of the Customs, or the inspecting commanders of the Coast-guard, shall see their subordinate officers furnished with the name and address of the union or parochial medical officer.

VI. And we do further order, that in the event of the occurrence of one or more of such cases of illness, and upon request from any passengers or seamen, or without such request where there is reasonable ground for believing that there is a case of cholera or other epidemic disease on board, or where more than one person on board is suffering from illness of the like symptoms, the captain of any British ship shall, himself, forthwith, and without any inquiry by any Customs officer or pilot, send such notice as aforesaid, and procure the attendance of any union or parochial medical officer or medical officer of quarantine.

VII. And we do hereby order and direct, that such union or parochial medical officer or medical officer of quarantine shall, upon receiving such notification, forthwith go on board the vessel and examine the cases of sickness on board, and act in respect thereto as if such cases had occurred in dwellings on shore.

VIII. And in case he shall find that the cabin or hold of the vessel where the sick person lies is in a filthy condition and without proper accommodation, or that from the number of persons on board there is danger of the spreading of the disease, or that there is not on board proper attendance or means for the suitable treatment of the sick, we do further order and direct, that in every such case the medical officer shall take order for providing suitable accommodation on shore for such patients, for their removal thereto, and for their treatment therein.

IX. And in case of any vessel arriving at or lying in any port, river, or creek, or near the coast, in any part of the United Kingdom, out of the jurisdiction of the Poor Law Amendment Act, where no medical officers are appointed, then application shall be made by the captain, or any officer in charge, to any duly licensed medical practitioner.

X. And we do further order, that where there is on board of such vessel any case of epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, or in case of the arrival of the vessel from any port or coast of any country where it is known that cholera or other epidemic or endemic diseases are prevalent, such medical officer shall and is hereby authorized to take measures for the protection of the passengers and crew on board such vessel; and for such purpose all directions and regulations of this Board in force for the time being under any Order of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council with respect to dwellings on shore, shall, in so far as applicable, extend to such vessel.

XI. And we do hereby order and direct, that all officers of Customs, or of the Coast-guard, appointed to take charge of vessels on their arrival, and every pilot, shall keep and carry with them copies of these our directions, and shall call the attention of the captain of the vessel to them.
