The Queen has been pleased to give and grant unto Samuel-Thomas Gully, Clerk, Rector of Berrynarbor, in the county of Devon, in the Commission of the Peace for the said county, and of Trevennen House, in the parish of Gorran, in the county of Cornwall, second but only surviving son and heir of William-Slade Gully, of Trevennen House aforesaid, Esquire, deceased, Her royal licence and authority that he may (in compliance with a clause contained in the last will and testament of his late father, the said William-Slade Gully) assume the surname of Slade, in addition to and before that of Gully, and henceforth be called Samuel-Thomas Slade-Gully, and that he may bear the arms of Slade quarterly with those of Gully, and that the said surname and arms may be taken, used, and borne by his issue; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office, otherwise the said royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
