To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the parish of Romford, in the county of Essex;—

To the Clerk or Clerks to the Justices of the Petty Sessions held for the division or divisions in which the said parish is situate;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

**WHEREAS** the population of the parish of Romford, in the county of Essex, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons:

And whereas at a meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held in the said parish after a public notice in that behalf, on Saturday the twenty-fifth day of June last, it was resolved,—

“That the Chapelwardens be instructed to apply to the Poor Law Commissioners to make an order that the ‘Vestries and Vestry Clerks Act’ be applied to and be put in force, so far as providing a vestry-room, within this parish.”

And whereas the Chapelwardens of the said parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above resolution.

Now, therefore, we, the said Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, do hereby order and direct, that so much of the said Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled “An Act to prevent the holding of vestry or other meetings in churches, and for regulating the appointment of Vestry Clerks,” as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings for the purpose of holding any vestry or other meeting for the transaction of any business of or relating to the said parish, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Romford.

And we hereby order and direct that a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
