PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HER Majesty being compelled to declare war against His Imperial Majesty the Emperor of all the Russias, and being desirous to lessen as much as possible the evils thereof, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Russian merchant vessels which, at the time of the publication of this Order, shall be in any ports or places in Her Majesty's Indian territories, under the Government of the East India Company, or within any of Her Majesty's foreign or colonial possessions, shall be allowed thirty days from the time of the publication of this Order in such Indian territories, or foreign or colonial possession, for loading their cargoes and departing from such ports or places; and that such Russian merchant vessels, if met at sea by any of Her Majesty's ships, shall be permitted to continue their voyage if, on examination of their papers, it shall appear that their cargoes were taken on board before the expiration of the above term. Provided that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be taken to extend, to Russian vessels having on board any officer in the military or naval service of the enemy, or any article prohibited or contraband of war, or any despatch of or to the Russian Government.

And it is hereby further ordered by Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council as aforesaid, that any Russian merchant vessel which, prior to the twenty-ninth day of March now last past, shall have sailed from any foreign port, bound for any port or place in any of Her Majesty's Indian territories, or foreign or colonial possessions, shall be permitted to enter such port or place, and to discharge her cargo, and afterwards forthwith to depart without molestation; and that any such vessel, if met at sea by any of Her Majesty's ships, shall be permitted to continue her voyage to any port not blockaded.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, the Lords

Commissioners of the Admiralty, and Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for War and the Colonies, the Right Honourable the Commissioners for the Affairs of India, and all governors, officers, and authorities, whom it may concern, in Her Majesty's East Indian, foreign, and colonial possessions, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a French Imperial Decree from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, regulating the restitution of the duty on unwrought iron used in the manufacture of steam engines, of which the following is a copy:

Art. 1. A partir du 1er Juin, 1854, la restitution du droit d'entrée sur les fontes brutes étrangères, employées à la fabrication des machines à feu de 100 chevaux ou plus, dont l'installation à bord des navires destinés à la navigation maritime aura été dûment constatée par les agents des douanes, s'effectuera à raison de 300 kilogrammes de fonte par cheval de force, y compris le déchet de fabrication, et de 4 fr. 80 cents. par chaque 100 kilogrammes.

Art. 2. Sont maintenues en vigueur les dispositions de l'ordonnance du 30 Mai, 1839, qui ne sont pas abrogées par l'Art. 1er du présent décret.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of postage," power is given to the Postmaster-General to remit any of the rates of British postage for the time being, payable by law on the transmission of post letters, newspapers, or other printed papers, to such extent as the Lords of the Treasury shall from time to time direct; and power is also given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British or inland postage, payable by law on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters or newspapers, or any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof, and a scale of weight to be contained in such Warrant.

And whereas it is expedient that regulations should be made for the transmission by the post of the letters and packets hereinafter mentioned.

Now, we, the undersigned, being two of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do, in exercise of the power or authority in us for such purpose vested, in and by the said Act, and of all other powers, enabling us in this behalf, by this Warrant, under our hands, direct, that on every letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight, transmitted by the post between any place in the United Kingdom and any port or place in Turkey or the Black Sea (the conveyance between the United Kingdom and Turkey or the Black Sea being by packet boat direct or *viâ* Malta), there shall be charged and taken, in lieu of any rates of postage now payable by law on such letters, an uniform rate of eleven pence.

And we direct, that on every letter, not exceeding half an ounce in weight, transmitted by the post, between any port or place in Turkey or the Black Sea, and any of Her Majesty's colonies, or any foreign country through the United Kingdom (the conveyance between Turkey or the Black Sea and the United Kingdom being by packet boat, direct or *viâ* Malta), there shall be charged and taken, in lieu of any rates of British postage now payable by law on such letters, the rates of postage following; that is to say:

For the conveyance of every such letter between Turkey or the Black Sea, and any part of the United Kingdom, a rate of eleven pence, and for the conveyance of every such letter between the port in the United Kingdom of the departure or arrival of the packet or ship conveying the same, and the colony or foreign country to or from which the same shall be forwarded, such a further or additional rate of postage as shall from time to time be charged and payable for British postage on letters posted or delivered at the port in the United Kingdom of the departure or arrival of the packet or ship conveying the same, and transmitted direct between such port and any such colony or foreign country.

And we direct, that on every letter transmitted as is mentioned in this Warrant, exceeding half an ounce in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid progressive and additional rates of postage as follows; that is to say:

On every such letter exceeding half an ounce in weight and not exceeding one ounce in weight, two rates of postage.

On every such letter exceeding one ounce and not exceeding two ounces in weight, four rates of postage.

On every such letter exceeding two ounces and not exceeding three ounces in weight, six rates of postage.

And on every such letter exceeding three ounces and not exceeding four ounces in weight, eight rates of postage.

And for every ounce in weight above the weight of four ounces, there shall be charged and taken two additional rates of postage; and every fraction of an ounce above the weight of four ounces shall be charged as one additional ounce; and each progressive and additional rate, chargeable under this clause, shall be estimated and charged at the sum which any such letter would be charged with under this Warrant if not exceeding half an ounce in weight.

And we further direct, that on every printed British newspaper transmitted by the post between any place in the United Kingdom and any port or place in Turkey or the Black Sea (the conveyance between the United Kingdom and Turkey or the Black Sea being by packet boat direct, or *viâ* Malta, or by private ship direct), there shall be charged and taken, in lieu of any rates of postage now payable by law on such newspapers, an uniform rate of one penny; and every printed supplement or additional sheet to any such newspaper shall, for the purpose of charging the postage under this Warrant, be deemed a distinct newspaper, unless sent in the same cover, or together with the newspaper to which it is a supplement or addition.

And we direct that no such printed newspaper shall be sent by the post at the rate aforesaid, unless the following conditions shall be observed:

- 1st. It shall be sent without a cover, or in a band or cover open at the sides or ends.
- 2nd. There shall be no word or communication printed on the newspaper after its publication or upon the cover thereof, nor any writing or marks upon it, or upon the cover of it, except the name and address of the person to whom sent.
- 3rd. There shall be no paper or thing enclosed in or with any such newspaper.

And in case any one of such conditions shall not be fulfilled the whole paper or packet shall be charged with the letter rates of postage.

And we further direct that nothing herein contained shall be deemed or construed to extend to any letters or newspapers passing by the post, between the United Kingdom and Turkey, or the Black Sea *viâ* France, which are to be charged with the same rates of postage as if this Warrant had not been signed.
