**T**HE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Stockholm, transmitting a Proclamation issued by the Swedish Minister of Marine (a translation of which is subjoined), relative to certain alterations of the Lights on the coast of Sweden, near Gotenburg.

## PROCLAMATION.

THE Royal Administration of Marine announces, for the information and guidance of Mariners, that according to His Majesty's gracious Decree of the 2nd February last, a Lighthouse is to be erected on Winga Point, near to the one which is there at present, and provided with a Lens Light of the Fourth Degree, "à courtes éclipses," or, as it is also called, "à feu fixe varié par des éclats," of the same description as the light which is to be put up this summer at Koster. The Winga Light is to be ready in time to be used at the beginning of the autumn of this year.

In connexion with this the Light at Baskör, situated within Winga, which at present is provided with white window glass, is to have red glass, by which means this Harbour Light will present a red appearance, distinguishing it from the lights at Winga and Böttö.

Further provisions concerning the times for lighting the Winga Lighthouse, and the direction of the new lighthouse and its distance from the present fixed light, will henceforth be announced in the Official Gazette.
