THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Stockholm, inclosing a translation of a Proclamation issued by the Swedish Ministry of Marine (copy of which is subjoined), notifying the "Flagmarks" which have been set up on certain shoals in the Gulf of Bothnia.

(Translation.)

THE Royal Administration of Marine announces, for the information and guidance of Mariners,

that according to His Majesty's gracious command, a great Flagmark has been set up on the east side of each of the two Fuingrunds, and on Grundkallegrund, situated in the South Qrarken, east of "Grason," viz.:

East Fuingrund,

the shallowest portion of which is hardly 2 fathoms deep, with an extent of about 700 fathoms in length, from W.S.W. to E.N.E., in an average of 4 fathoms of water. East of the shallowest spot, at a distance of about 500 fathoms, 5½ fathoms deep, a large mark is moored, the iron cone of which bears an iron pole 12 feet long, painted white, and furnished at the top with a large red ball, which is visible at a distance of ½ geographical mile. This shoal can be sounded up to from the north.

West Fuingrund

has its shallowest spot only from 5 to 7 feet water. The shoal, which is of a triangular form, has its longest sides 4 and 700 fathoms in length in the respective directions of N.W. and S.E. About 330 fathoms from the shallowest point, and east of the same, in 6½ fathoms water, a mark is set up of similar size and form to that on the east shoal; but its pole is painted red and its ball white; it also is visible at a distance of ½ geographical mile. This shoal cannot be sounded up to from the north side with any security.

Grundkallegrund.

At this extensive shoal, the limits of which are not fixed, are found alternately, deep water up to 10 fathoms and more, great pieces of rock, and isolated stones, one of which is visible above the water. East of one of these shallow points, which has however no stone above the water, a large mark is moored, which has a pole 15 feet long, the upper end of which is furnished with a red streamer. The mark stands in a depth of 9 fathoms, and about 330 fathoms from the Shallows itself. This mark is visible about a geographical mile off in favourable weather. So far as is known, this shoal, the extent of which from N. to S. is about a geographical mile, cannot be sounded up to. To avoid it, one must keep eastward till Understen, or some other known spot comes in sight, by which the course can be shaped. All the directions here given are reckoned by well regulated compasses.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Christiania, modifying the regulations respecting quarantine for cholera on the south coast of Norway, of which the following is a copy.

(Translation.)

By the highest authority it has been graciously resolved:—

First.—That along the whole coast from the Swedish Frontiers to Bergen, that town and harbour, with channels leading to it, all restrictions with respect to cholera on vessels arriving from an infected or uninfected port in the country or abroad, are annulled, unless during the voyage they have had, or on arrival they have, any one on board sick of, or dead from, malignant cholera; in which case quarantine will have to be observed in conformity with the 1 § of the Royal Resolution of the 25th June, 1849.

Second.—That with respect to the quarantine in the ports of the kingdom, the same rule is to be observed as regards vessels arriving from a national port, but conformable to the existing regulations for vessels arriving from foreign ports.

Third.—That all quarantine against cholera in infected places is abrogated.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

THE Minister of Marine gives further notice, that the lights on the two newly erected lighthouses on the Island of Schiermonnikoog have been lighted on the evening of the 1st of September for the first time, and since that day burn every night from sunset to sunrise; that the two fixed lenticular lamp lights aforesaid, being of the third size, are each placed on a round tower of

stone, on the sandhills, standing N.W. by N. and S.E. by S., at a distance of 1008 Netherland ells (3211 Rhineland feet) from each other.

The most southerly and highest light stands 44.9 ells (143 Rhineland feet) above ordinary high water, in 53° 28' 56" northern latitude, and 6° 9' 49" longitude east of Greenwich; illumines a bow of the horizon of 245°, namely, from E. N.E., through the north and west, to the south.

The most northerly light stands 42.30 ells (135 Rhineland feet) above ordinary high water, in 53° 29' 14" northern latitude, and 6° 9' 3" longitude east of Greenwich; illumines a bow of the horizon of 135°, and likewise from E. N.E. through the north, to W. N.W.

According to observations taken from the deck of a pilot boat, with the eye 3½ Netherland ells (11 Rhineland feet) above the surface of the water, it appears—

That the Lights of Schiermonnikoog, bearing W.S.W. (rather west), and at the same time the Light of Borkum, bearing S.E. ¼ S. at the depth of fully 7½ à 8 fathoms, are lost sight of or declined (and the most northerly first) at a distance of fully 3½ German sea miles (14 English miles). These lights, bearing S.E. by S. to S.E., with the eye at the same elevation above the surface of the water, then at 14 fathoms' depth, with fine greyish sand bottom and with the lights level with the horizon to the eye, steering S.W. by S. and S.S.W. towards the coast, the most northerly light disappears in the E.S.E. (rather east), being there at 5½ and nearly 6 fathoms' depth, close against the Ameland shore, the steeple of Nes on Ameland bearing S.W., which cross-bearing accordingly gives a distance there of fully 3¼ miles (13 English miles) from the most northerly light of Schiermonnikoog.

It has likewise been found that coming round the east from sea, and getting both these lights in view in the W.S.W., and steering for them, one runs along and free of the west point of the Borkum Reef and the Geldzak Shoal, at 4½ à 5 fathoms' depth.

By keeping these lights together in one and the same line, bearing S.E. by S., this direction is very useful for observation above the Friesland Sea Gat.

Inside, towards the west and south side, the most southerly light remains visible to between Oostmahorn and the Zoutkamp, in the passage the Slenk, somewhat S.E. of the buoy called the Babbelaar, near the Vlaken or Schelphoek, where the light then diminishes and disappears in the N. ¼ W.

It has also been observed that the Lights of Schiermonnikoog, at ordinary view and with the eye, 4 ells (12½ Rhineland feet) above water, are quite visible at a distance of fully 4 miles (16 English miles), more or less, according to the state of the atmosphere, and in proportion as the eye is raised above the surface of the water.

These Lights retain a bright brilliancy until they are extinguished; they likewise rise brightly above the horizon, and only there, where according to the above-described lines of compass, illumination commences or terminates; they neither increase nor decrease suddenly, but gradually; at two miles' distance from these Lighthouses, both Lights are visible at equal heights above the horizon.

The above bearings are according to non-adjusted compass, the non-adjustment calculated at 21° 42' N.W., and the depth as at ordinary low-water.

NORTH UNST, SHETLAND—TEMPORARY
LIGHTHOUSE.

THE Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses hereby give notice, that, with the view to a permanent light being ultimately established in the same locality, a temporary Lighthouse tower has been erected off the North End of the Island of Unst, in Shetland, and that the Light will be exhibited therefrom for the first time on the night of Wednesday, 11th October, 1854, and every night thereafter, from the going away of daylight in the evening till the return of daylight in the morning.

The following is a Specification of the Lighthouse, and the Appearance of the Light, by MR. DAVID STEVENSON, Engineer to the Commissioners:—

The Temporary Lighthouse is erected on Muckle Flugga, being one of the group of rocks called the Burra Fiord Holms, which lie off the headland of Hermaness, being the northern extremity of the Island of Unst. The Lighthouse is in N. Lat. 60° 51' 20", and W. Long. 0° 53' 3".

The small rock called the Out Stack, which is the most northern rock of the Shetland Isles, bears from the Lighthouse about E. b. N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. by compass, and is distant about half a nautical mile.

The North Unst Light will be known to Mariners as a Fixed Light, of the natural colour. It is elevated about 165 feet above the level of high-water of ordinary spring-tides, and may be seen at the distance of about nineteen nautical miles, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

The Commissioners further give notice, that by Order in Council, dated the 3rd day of July last, the following tolls are authorized to be levied in respect of the said Lighthouse; viz. :—

For every vessel belonging to the United Kingdom (the same not belonging to Her Majesty, her heirs or successors, nor being navigated wholly in ballast), and for every foreign vessel privileged to enter the ports of the United Kingdom upon paying the same duties of tonnage as are payable by British vessels which may pass or derive benefit from the light, the toll of two-sixteenths of a penny per ton of the burthen of every such vessel, for every time of passing or deriving benefit therefrom, if on a coasting voyage.

For each time of passing or deriving benefit on an oversea voyage, one penny per ton for every such vessel.

For every foreign vessel not navigated wholly in ballast, and not privileged in manner before

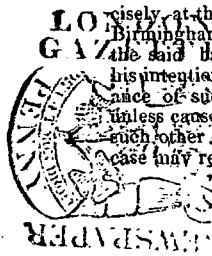
