THE Earl of Clarendon, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from Lord Cowley, Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, the subjoined copies of a letter, addressed by his Excellency to M. Drouyn de Lhuys, Minister for Foreign Affairs to His Majesty the Emperor of the French, offering the condolence of Her Majesty's Government on the lamented death of the late Marshal St. Arnaud; and of a letter, addressed by M. Drouyn de Lhuys to Lord Cowley, in reply.

Paris, October 10, 1854.

M. LE MINISTRE,

I AM desired by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, to take the earliest opportunity of conveying to the Emperor the expression of the deep regret with which the Queen's Government have learnt the intelligence of the death of Marshal St. Arnaud. Her Majesty's Government desire to offer to His Imperial Majesty and to the French People their condolence on an event which has deprived the Emperor and France of the services of so distinguished and brave a General. If anything could mitigate the sorrow that must be felt by the Governments and People of France and England upon this occasion, it must be the satisfaction—though a mournful one—that the Marshal's last moments were preceded and cheered by the triumph of a victory, which will always be glorious in the military annals of both countries.

In requesting your Excellency to convey these sentiments to the knowledge of the Emperor, I trust that I may be permitted to add the expression of my personal regrets for the loss which the Emperor and the French Nation have sustained. To know Marshal St. Arnaud was to like him; for the courtesy and affability of his private life was as remarkable as his courage and firmness in the field.

J'AI placé sous les yeux de l'Empereur la lettre que Votre Excellence m'a fait l'honneur de m'écrire le 10 du courant, et qui contient l'expression des

regrets éprouvés par le Gouvernement de Sa Majesté Britannique en apprenant la perte déplorable que la France a faite du Maréchal St. Arnaud. L'Empereur a été vivement touché d'une démarche qui témoigne avec tant d'évidence de l'union de son Gouvernement avec celui de la Reine, et de la part sincère que les deux pays sont désormais appelés à prendre à tout ce qui peut être pour l'un ou pour l'autre un sujet de deuil ou de joie. Si, dans cette circonstance, quelque chose a pu adoucir le sentiment douloureux que l'Empereur et la France ont ressenti d'une telle perte, c'est en effet, comme le dit si bien Votre Excellence, la satisfaction qu'a pu emporter en mourant le Maréchal de St. Arnaud qu'il venait d'inscrire son nom à côté de celui d'heroïques alliés sur une des pages les plus glorieuses des annales militaires de l'Angleterre et de la France.

Je n'ai pas besoin, my Lord, d'ajouter que les termes si courtois dans lesquels Votre Excellence s'exprime personnellement sur le Maréchal ont été appréciés comme ils devaient l'être.

M. L'AMBASSADEUR,

I HAVE laid before the Emperor the letter that your Excellency did me the honour to address to me on the 10th instant, containing the expression of regret felt by the Government of Her Britannic Majesty on learning the lamentable loss which France has sustained by the death of Marshal St. Arnaud. The Emperor has been deeply affected by a proceeding which gives such evidence of the union of this Government with that of the Queen, and of the sincerity with which the two countries are henceforth called upon to participate in all that can be for either of them a subject of mourning or of joy. If, under the present circumstances, anything could assuage the grief which the Emperor and France have felt at such a loss, it is truly, as your Excellency has so well said, the satisfaction which Marshal St. Arnaud was enabled in dying to experience, that he had just inscribed his name in conjunction with those of heroic allies on one of the most glorious pages of the military annals of England and France.

I have no need, my Lord, to add that the terms in which your Excellency has so courteously expressed yourself personally in regard to the Marshal, have been duly appreciated.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of postage," power is given to the Postmaster-General to remit any of the rates of British postage for the time being, payable by law on the transmission of post letters, newspapers, or other printed papers, to such extent as the Lords of the Treasury shall from time to time direct; and power is also given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury from time to time, by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British or Inland postage, payable by law on the transmission by the post of Foreign or Colonial letters or newspapers, or any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof, and a scale of weight to be contained in such Warrant.

And whereas it is expedient that regulations should be made for the transmission by the post of the letters hereinafter mentioned.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the power or authority in us for such purpose vested in and by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant (under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, by the authority of the statute in that case made and provided) order and direct, that on every letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight, posted in or addressed to any part of the United Kingdom, and sent from or to any commissioned or non-commissioned officer, serjeant, corporal, drummer, trumpeter, fifer, or private soldier, employed in Her Majesty's regular forces, artillery, or royal marines, in the Kingdom of Greece, or sent from or to any commissioned or warrant officer, midshipman, master's mate or seaman employed in Her Majesty's Navy, or any of Her Majesty's ships in Greece, transmitted by the post between any place in the United Kingdom, and any port or place in Greece (the conveyance between the United Kingdom and Greece, being through France *via* Marseilles by the French Mediterranean Packet Boats), there shall be charged and taken, in lieu of any rates of postage now payable by law on such letters, an uniform British rate of one penny.

And we direct, that on every letter transmitted as is mentioned in this Warrant, exceeding half an ounce in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid progressive and additional rates of postage as follows; that is to say:

On every such letter, exceeding half an ounce in weight, and not exceeding one ounce in weight, two rates of postage.

On every such letter exceeding one ounce, and not exceeding two ounces in weight, four rates of postage.

On every such letter exceeding two ounces, and not exceeding three ounces in weight, six rates of postage.

And for every ounce in weight above the weight of three ounces, there shall be charged and taken two additional rates of postage; and every fraction of an ounce above the weight of three ounces shall be charged as one additional ounce; and each progressive and additional rate, chargeable under this clause, shall be estimated and charged at the sum which any such letter would be charged with under this Warrant, if not exceeding half an ounce in weight.

And we further direct, that in respect of letters sent by any non-commissioned officers, serjeants, corporals, drummers, fifers, private soldiers or seamen, under the regulations of this Warrant, the following conditions shall be observed (that is to say), upon each such letter shall be superscribed the name of the writer, and his class or description in the regiment, detachment, or vessel to which he shall belong; and upon every such letter there shall be written in the handwriting of, and signed by, the officer having at the time the command of the regiment, detachment, or vessel, to which the privileged person belongs, the name of such officer and the name of such regiment, detachment, or vessel.

And we further direct, that in respect to letters received by the post under this Warrant, by any commissioned or warrant officers, midshipmen, or master's mates, or any non-commissioned officers, private soldiers, or seamen, the following conditions shall be observed, that is to say: the postage of each such letter posted in the United Kingdom shall be prepaid, either in money or by the proper stamp or stamps being affixed thereto, at the time of the same being posted; and as to letters received by any non-commissioned officers, private soldiers, or seamen, each letter shall be directed to the privileged person, specifying on the superscription thereof, the regiment, detachment, or vessel to which he shall belong.

And we further direct, that if in any case the conditions hereinbefore prescribed be not complied with, the letter shall be charged with the same rates of postage as if this Warrant had not been signed.

And we further direct, that all letters, which shall be sent by the post under the regulations of this Warrant, shall be subject, in addition to the British rates hereby fixed, to the payment of any foreign postage which may be chargeable thereon.

And we further direct, that the several terms and expressions used in this Warrant shall be construed to have the like meaning in all respects as they would have had if inserted in the said recited Act.

Provided lastly, and we hereby declare and direct, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury, or any two of them, by Warrant under their hands, at any time hereafter, to alter or repeal any of the rates hereby altered, or the regulations hereby made, and to make and establish any new or other rates or regulations in lieu thereof, and from time to time to appoint at what time the rates that may be payable are to be paid.
