IT is hereby notified that the Earl of Clarendon, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State, for Foreign Affairs, has received from the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a copy of a Despatch, dated "Duke of Wellington, off Faro Sound, 21st October, 1854," from Vice-Admiral Sir Charles Napier, K.C.B., Commander-in-Chief of Her Majesty's Naval Forces in the Baltic, informing their lordships that he had raised the blockade of the Russian Ports undermentioned from that date.

"Islands of Aro, Uto, the Aland Archipelago, Nystad, Bjerneborg, Christianstad, Wasa, Walgrund Islands, Little Carleby, Jacobstad, Great Carlby, Lotto, Kalajoki, Brahistad, Uleaborg, Karle Island, Ijo Gestila, Kemi, and all intermediate Russian Ports to Neder Tornea, situated at the head of the Gulf of Bothnia, in lat. (about) 65° 50' N., long. 24° 15' East."

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty, it was enacted that when and as often as it should seem expedient to the justices of any county, that such county should be divided into two or more districts for the purpose of the said Act, or that any alteration should be made of any division theretofore made under the said Act, it should be lawful for the said justices, in general or quarter sessions assembled, to resolve that a petition should be presented to Her Majesty, praying that such division or alteration be made, and thereupon to adjourn the further consideration of such petition until notice thereof should be given to the coroner or coroners of such county as hereinafter provided. And that the clerk of the peace should give notice of any such resolution to every coroner of such county, and of the time when the petition will be taken by the said justices into consideration, and the justices should confer with every such coroner who should attend the meeting of the justices for that purpose touching such petition, having due regard to the size and nature of each proposed district, the number of the inhabitants, the nature of their employment, and such other circumstances as should

appear to the justices fit to be considered in carrying into execution the provisions of this Act, and such petition, with a description of the several proposed districts, and of the boundaries thereof, with the reasons upon which the petition is founded, should be certified to Her Majesty under the hands and seals of two or more of the justices present, when such petition should be agreed to, and the clerk of the peace for such county should forthwith give or send a true copy of such petitions certified under his hand to every coroner of such county.

And whereas the justices of the county of Cornwall in quarter sessions assembled did on the fourth day of April, A.D. one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, resolve that a petition should be presented to Her Majesty, praying that the said county shall be divided into five districts for the purposes of the aforesaid Act; thereupon the consideration of the said petition was adjourned according to the provisions of the said Act, and due notice of the said resolution and of the time when the same would be taken into consideration was duly given to the existing coroners for the said county, and the said petition was afterwards duly taken into consideration and agreed to by the justices of the said county in pursuance of the said Act, and the clerk of the peace for the said county did forthwith, on the said petition being agreed to, give a true copy thereof, certified under his hand, to the existing coroners for the said county. And whereas the said petition hath been certified to Her Majesty under the hands and seals of two or more of the justices present when the same was agreed to, and the prayer thereof is that the said county may be divided into the five districts hereinafter described for the purposes of the said Act, and that the courts for the election of coroners shall be holden at the places hereafter in that behalf mentioned.

And whereas it has seemed fit for Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Privy Council after taking the said petition into consideration, to order that the said county shall be divided into the said five districts for the purposes of the said Act: Now it is hereby ordered that the county of Cornwall shall be divided into five districts for the purposes of the said Act, and that the districts shall be called the

Launceston District,
Bodmin District,
Liskeard District,
Truro District,
and
Western District respectively.
