Bridport and Broadwindsor Roads.

(Continuation of Term—Repeal or Amendment of Act.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session, for an Act to alter, amend, extend, and enlarge, and to continue for a further term of

years, the powers and provisions of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty George the Fourth, intituled "An Act for making and maintaining a Turnpike Road from the Bridport Turnpike Road at Allington, through Broadwindsor and Drimpton, in the county of Dorset, to the Crewkerne Turnpike Road at or near Clapton Bridge, and also from Hewish Toll-gate to the Crewkerne Turnpike Road, at or near Roundbam Corner, in the parish of Crewkerne, in the county of Somerset," or otherwise to repeal the said Act, and to consolidate all or some of the provisions thereof, and of the said intended Act, into one Act, and that powers will be applied for in the said intended Act to levy tolls, rates, and duties on the said road, and to alter or vary existing tolls, rates, and duties, and to confer, vary, or extinguish exemptions from payment of tolls, rates, and duties, and to confer, vary, or extinguish other rights and privileges.
