**A**T the Court at *Windsor*, the 27th day of *November*, 1854,

**PRESENT,**

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by an Act, passed in the tenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act for the more easy recovery of small debts and demands in England," it is, among other things, enacted, that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that the said Act be put in force in such county or counties as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, should seem fit, and to divide the whole or part of any such county (including all counties of cities and counties of towns, cities, boroughs, towns, ports, and places, liberties and franchises therein contained or thereunto adjoining) into districts; and to order that the County Court should be holden for the recovery of debts and demands, under the said Act, in each of such districts; and, from time to time, to alter such districts as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, should seem fit; and, from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to declare by what name, and in what towns and places, the County Court should be holden in each district:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by an Order in Council, of the ninth day of March one

thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, to order that the said Act be put in force in the counties and places therein specified, and the same was put in force accordingly.

And whereas it hath been represented, that it would be to the advantage of the public, if the following alteration were made in certain of the districts of the Courts, as specified or set forth in the aforesaid Order:

Her Majesty, having taken the premises into consideration, is thereupon pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five,—

The parishes of Box and Colerne, now in the district of the County Court of Wiltshire, holden at Chippenham, shall be in the district of the County Court of Somersetshire, holden at Bath.

The parishes of Sarnesfield and Kinnersley, now in the district of the County Court of Herefordshire, holden at Hereford, shall be in the district of the County Court of Herefordshire, holden at Kingston.

The parishes of Pedmore and Hagley, now in the district of the County Court of Worcestershire, holden at Bromsgrove, shall be in the district of the County Court of Worcestershire, holden at Stourbridge.

The parishes of Tibberton, Hindlip, Warndon, and Claines (except the township of Whistoness), now in the district of the County Court of Worcestershire, holden at Droitwich, shall be in the district of the County Court of Worcestershire, holden at Worcester.

The parishes of White Ladies Aston, Bredicott, Churchill, Broughton-Hackett, Norton-juxta-Kempsey, and Spetchley, now in the district of the County Court of Worcestershire, holden at Pershore, shall be in the district of the County Court of Worcestershire, holden at Worcester.

The parishes of Powick and Kempsey, now in the district of the County Court of Worcestershire, holden at Upton-on-Severn, shall be in the district of the County Court of Worcestershire, holden at Worcester.

The parishes of Caxton, Croxton, Eltisley, Great Gransden and Little Gransden, now in the district of the County Court of Cambridgeshire, holden at Cambridge, shall be in the district of the County Court of Huntingdonshire, holden at Saint Neots.
