A T the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 11th day of December, 1854,

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth Victoria, cap. seventy-eight, entitled "The Admiralty Court Act, 1854," it is amongst other things enacted, that Her Majesty may by Her Order in Council from time to time, vary, alter, or abolish, all or any of the Fees payable in relation to proceedings in the High Court of Admiralty of England, and may substitute one or more Fee or Fees in lieu thereof, and may direct that all or any of such Fees shall from a day to be named in such Order, and thenceforth, be collected by means of stamps, to be provided and used in manner thereinafter mentioned.

And whereas it hath been represented unto Her Majesty by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, that they have received from the Right Honourable Stephen Lushington, the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty of England, a recommendation to the effect that it would be desirable to simplify the Tables of Fees now payable in the said Court, and to provide for the collection thereof by means of stamps in the manner hereinafter mentioned; and the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury have approved of such recommendation.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty is pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, and until Her Majesty shall be pleased otherwise to direct, the Fees in the annexed schedule, marked from No. 1 to No. 73, inclusive, shall be substituted in lieu of the Fees now payable to the Judge, Registrar, Merchants, and Marshal of the High Court of Admiralty of England, and which, under the provisions of the Act of the third and fourth Victoria, cap. sixty-six, are now carried to the Fee Fund of the said Court.

And Her Majesty is further pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that all the said Fees, numbered from No. 1 to No. 73, inclusive, shall, from the day aforesaid, be collected by means of stamps, whether adhesive or affixed, and under such regulations as the Judge of the said Court shall direct.

And Her Majesty is also further pleased to

order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Fees in the annexed schedule, marked from No. 74 to No. 76, inclusive, shall, from the said first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, be payable to the Seal Keeper of the said Court, in lieu of the Fees now payable to him in respect of that office.

And her Majesty is also pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that in lieu of the Fees now payable to the Cryer of the said Court, there shall, from the day aforesaid, be payable to him a uniform fee of five shillings, on every interlocutory decree, sentence, or motion in Court, to be paid by the party in whose favour such decree or sentence has been given, or by whom such motion has been made.

Whereof the Judge, Registrar, and other officers of the said Court, the Commissioners of Inland Revenue, and all others whom it may concern, are to take notice, and to govern themselves accordingly.

MEMORANDUM.

Horse Guards, 9th December, 1854.

The Queen has been pleased to command that, as a mark of Her Majesty's recognition of the meritorious services of the non-commissioned officers of the army under the command of Field-Marshal Lord Raglan, in the recent brilliant operations in the Crimea, the Field-Marshal shall submit, through the General Commanding-inchief, the name of one serjeant of each regiment of Cavalry, of the three battalions of the Foot Guards, and of every regiment of Infantry of the Line, to be promoted to a Cornetcy or Ensigncy, for Her Majesty's approval; and, with the view

to render immediately available the services of these meritorious men, Her Majesty has directed that the Field-Marshal do appoint, provisionally and pending Her Majesty's pleasure, the serjeants so recommended, to regiments in the army under his command; and Her Majesty has further been graciously pleased to signify her intention that, on the several recommendations receiving Her Majesty's approval, the commission shall in each case bear date the 5th November, 1854.

WARRANT' granting Annuities and Gratuities to Non-commissioned Officers and Men of the Army serving under the command of Field-Marshal Lord Raglan.

VICTORIA R.

Whereas by Our Royal Warrant of the 4th June, 1853, We were pleased to extend the rewards to serjeants of Our Army for distinguished service from £2,000 a year to £4,000 a year, by an annual progression at the rate of £250 a year, or such other rate as might be deemed most expedient by Our Secretary at War; and whereas We deem it expedient to mark Our sense of the distinguished, gallant, and good conduct of the Army serving in the East, under the command of Field-Marshal Lord Raglan, Our will and pleasure is, that one serjeant in each regiment of cavalry and infantry, and of each battalion of the Foot Guards, and of the Rifle Brigade serving in the East, in the Crimea, or elsewhere, under the command of Field-Marshal Lord Raglan, shall be selected by the commanding officer and recommended to Us for the grant of an annuity not exceeding £20, provided that the aggregate of grants now made, and to be made, shall not exceed £4,000 in any one year.

The annuity so granted is to be at the disposal of such serjeant, although he may be still in Our service.

It is also Our will and pleasure to extend the provisions of Our Royal Warrant of the 13th April, 1854, and with the special view of marking Our sense of the distinguished service and gallant conduct in the field of Our Army now serving in the East, in the Crimea, or elsewhere, under the command of Field-Marshal Lord Raglan, to order and direct that the commanding officer of each regiment of cavalry shall be allowed to recommend one serjeant, two corporals, and four privates, and the commanding officer of each regiment of infantry, and of each battalion of Foot Guards, and of the Rifle Brigade, shall be allowed to recommend one serjeant, four corporals, and ten privates, to receive a medal and a gratuity of

The gratuity to be placed in the Regimental Savings' Bank, there to remain in deposit at interest until his discharge from Our service, and to be deemed to be his personal property, in conformity with the terms of Our Royal Warrant of 13th April, 1854.
