Convention between Her Majesty and the Emperor of the French, additional to the Convention of April 3, 1843, relative to Post-office arrangements.

Signed at Paris, December 12, 1854.

[Ratifications exchanged at Paris, December 22, 1854.]

ER Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and His Majesty the Emperor of the French, alike animated by the desire of improving, by means of a new Convention, the Postal Service between the two countries, have named as their Plenipotentiaries for that purpose; that is to say:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the Right Honourable Henry Richard Charles, Lord Cowley, a Peer of the United Kingdom, a Member of Her Majesty's Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Her Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to His Majesty the Emperor of the French;

His Majesty the Emperor of the French, M. Edward Drouyn de Lhuys, His Minister and Secretary of State of the Department of Foreign Affairs, Vice-President of the Senate, Great Cross of the Imperial Order of the Legion of Honour, &c., &c.;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

# ARTICLE I.

The postage to be collected in France and Algeria upon paid letters addressed to the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, as well as upon unpaid letters originating in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, shall be as follows:

1. For every paid letter, forty centimes per seven grammes and a half, or fraction of seven grammes and a half.

2. And for every unpaid letter, eighty centimes per seven grammes and a half, or fraction of seven grammes and a half.

Reciprocally, the postage to be collected in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland upon paid letters addressed to France and Algeria, as well as upon unpaid letters originating in France and Algeria, shall be as follows:

1. For every paid letter, four pence per quarter of an ounce British, or fraction of a quarter of an ounce British.

A Majesté la Reine du Royaume Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande, et Sa Majesté l'Empereur des Français, également animées du désir d'améliorer, au moyen d'une nouvelle Convention, le Service des Correspondances entre les deux pays, ont nommé pour leurs Plénipotentiaires à cet effet, savoir :

Lesquels, après s'être réciproquement communiqué leurs pleins pouvoirs respectifs, trouvés en bonne et due forme, sont convenus des Articles suivants:—

# ARTICLE I.

Le port à percevoir en France et en Algérie sur les lettres affranchies à destination du Royaume Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande, ainsi que sur les lettres non-affranchies originaires du Royaume Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande, est fixé, savoir:

1. Pour chaque lettre affranchie, à quarante centimes par sept grammes et demi, ou fraction de sept grammes et demi ;

2. Et pour chaque lettre non-affranchie, à quatre-vingts centimes par sept grammes et demi, ou fraction de sept grammes et demi.

Réciproquement, le port à percevoir dans le Royaume Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande sur les lettres affranchies à destination de la France et de l'Algérie, ainsi que sur les lettres non-affranchies originaires de la France et de l'Algérie, est fixé, savoir:

1. Pour chaque lettre affranchie, à quatre pence par quart d'once Britannique, ou fraction de quart d'once Britannique; 2. And for every unpaid letter, eight pence per quarter of an ounce British, or fraction of a quarter of an ounce British.

#### ARTICLE II.

The rate at which the Post Office of France shall account to the British Post Office, for paid letters addressed to Great Britain, forwarded by the French exchanging Offices to the British exchanging Offices, as well as for unpaid letters originating in Great Britain, forwarded by the British exchanging Offices to the French exchanging Offices, shall be as follows:

1. For paid letters addressed to Great Britain, the sum of sixty centimes per thirty grammes, net weight;

2. And for unpaid letters originating in Great Britain, the sum of one franc twenty centimes per

ounce British, net weight.

Reciprocally, the rate at which the British Post Office shall, on its side, account to the Post Office of France for paid letters addressed to France and Algeria, forwarded by the British exchanging Offices to the French exchanging Offices, as well as for unpaid letters originating in France and Algeria, forwarded by the French exchanging Offices to the British exchanging Offices, shall be as follows;

- 1. For paid letters addressed to France and Algeria, the sum of one franc per ounce British, net weight;
- 2. And for unpaid letters originating in France and Algeria, the sum of two francs per thirty grammes, net weight.

#### ARTICLE III.

The payment on account of the sea conveyance of letters contained in the mails which the respective Offices of Exchange transmit to each other by means of merchant-ships plying in the Channel, shall be equally divided between the British Post Office and the Post Office of France. These payments shall be made to the commanders or owners of the said vessels at the rate of one penny, or ten centimes, per letter.

#### ARTICLE IV.

The conditions under which newspapers, gazettes, periodical works, stitched books, pamphlets, sheets of music, catalogues, prospectuses, announcements and notices of various kinds, whether printed or lithographed, forwarded from one of the two countries addressed to the other, are to be exchanged, shall be regulated hereafter by a special Convention which shall be based upon the principle of compulsory prepayment to destination, and of the removal of every duty or tax which would otherwise be payable by the persons to whom newspapers and the other printed papers enumerated above are addressed.

# ARTICLE V.

The present Convention, which shall be considered as additional to the Convention of the 3rd of April, 1843, shall be ratified; the ratifications shall be exchanged at Paris as soon as possible; and it shall be put into execution on the 1st January, 1855.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Done in duplicate at Paris, the twelfth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four.

Réciproquement, le prix dont l'administration des Postes Britanniques devra, de son côté, tenir compte à l'administration des Postes de France pour les lettres affranchies à destination de la France et de l'Algérie, livrées par les Bureaux d'Echange Britanniques aux Bureaux d'Echange Français, ainsi que pour les lettres non-affranchies originaires de la France et de l'Algérie, livrées par les Bureaux d'Echange Français aux Bureaux d'Echange Britanniques, est fixé, savoir;

 Pour les lettres affranchies à destination de la France et de l'Algérie, à la somme d'un franc

par once Britannique, poids net;

2. Et pour les lettres non-affranchies originaires de la France et de l'Algérie, à la somme de deux francs par trente grammes, poids net.

#### ARTICLE III.

Les frais résultant du transport par mer des lettres comprises dans les dépêches que les Bureaux d'Echange respectifs se transmettront réciproquement par la voie des bâtiments du commerce naviguant dans le Canal de la Manche, seront supportés, par moitié, entre l'administration des Postes Britanniques et l'administration des Postes de France. Les frais seront payés aux capitaines ou armateurs des dits bâtiments à raison d'un penny, ou dix centimes, par lettre.

#### ARTICLE IV.

Les conditions d'échange des journaux, gazettes, ouvrages périodiques, livres brochés, brochures, papiers de musique, catalogues, prospectus, annonces et avis divers, imprimés, lithographiés, ou autographiés, addressés de l'un des deux pays dans l'autre, seront réglées ultérieurement par une Convention spéciale qui sera basée sur le principe de l'affranchissement obligatoire jusqu'à destination, et de l'abolition de tout droit ou taxe à la charge des destinataires des journaux et autres imprimés ci-dessus désignés.

#### ARTICLE V.

La présente Convention, qui sera considérée comme additionnelle à la Convention du 3 Avril, 1843, sera ratifiée; les ratifications en seront échangées à Paris aussitôt que faire se pourra; et elle sera mise à exécution le 1 Janvier, 1855.

En foi de quoi les Plénipotentiaires respectifs ont signé la présente Convention, et y ont apposé le sceau de leurs armes.

#### TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of postage," power is given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British or inland postage payable by law on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof.

And whereas further powers are given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury by an Act, passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for giving further facilities for the transmission of letters by post, and for the regulating the duties of postage thereon, and for other purposes relating

to the post-office.'

And whereas, in consequence of an additional treaty lately entered into between Her Majesty and the Emperor of the French, it is expedient to alter the rates of postage on the letters hereinafter mentioned; Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers vested in us in and by the said before-mentioned Acts, or either of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do. by this Warrant (under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, by the authority of the Statute in that case made and provided), order and direct that, on every letter not exceeding one quarter of an ounce in weight, posted in the United Kingdom, addressed to France or Algeria, or posted in France or Algeria, addressed to the United Kingdom and transmitted by the post direct, between any place in the United Kingdom and any place in France or Algeria, there shall be charged, taken, and paid, in lieu of any rates of postage now payable by law on such respective letters an uniform total rate of postage of four pence.

And that on every letter not exceeding one quarter of an ounce in weight, posted in the United Kingdom, addressed to any foreign country on the continent of Europe (Spain, Portugal, and France excepted), or to any of the islands in the Grecian Archipelago, or to Alexandria, Beyrout, Smyrna, or the Dardanelles, or posted in any such foreign countries (except as aforesaid), islands, ports, or places addressed to the United Kingdom, and transmitted by the post between any place in the United Kingdom and any such foreign countries (except as aforesaid), islands, ports, or places, via France, otherwise than in closed mails (the sea conveyance in the Mediterranean being by French packet boats), there shall be charged, taken, and paid in lieu of any rates of postage now payable by law on such respective letters, an uniform British

rate of postage of two pence.

And that on every letter not exceeding one quarter of an ounce in weight, posted in, or addressed to Algeria, France, or any other foreign countries on the continent of Europe (Spain and Portugal included), or to any of the islands in the Grecian Archipelago, or to Alexandria, Beyrout, Smyrna, or the Dardanelles, and transmitted by the post between Algeria, France, or any such other foreign countries, islands, ports or places, and Her Majesty's colonies of Jamaica, Canada, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, and Newfoundland, viâ France and the United Kingdom (the sea conveyance in the Mediterranean, being by French packet boats), there shall be charged, taken, and paid in lieu of any rates of postage now payable by law on such respective letters, an uniform British rate of one shilling.

And that on every letter not exceeding one quarter of an ounce in weight, posted in or addressed to Algeria, France, or any other foreign countries on the continent of Europe (Spain and Portugal included), or to any of the islands in the Grecian Archipelago, or to Alexandria, Beyrout, Smyrna, or the Dardanelles, and transmitted by the post between France, or any such other foreign countries, islands, ports or places, and any port in Her Majesty's colonies (Jamaica, Canada, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, and Newfoundland excepted), via France and the United Kingdom (the sea conveyance in the Mediterranean being by French packet boats), there shall be charged, taken, and paid in lieu of any rates of postage now payable by law on such respective letters, an uniform Bristish rate of ten

pence.

And we direct that on every letter transmitted as is mentioned in this Warrant, exceeding a quarter of an ounce in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid in lieu of any rates of postage now payable by law on such respective letters, progressive and additional rates of postage as follows (that is to say):

On every letter exceeding a quarter of an ounce in weight, and not exceeding half an ounce in weight, two rates of postage.

On every letter exceeding half an ounce in weight, and not exceeding three quarters of an ounce in weight, three rates of postage.

On every letter exceeding three-quarters of an ounce in weight, and not exceeding one ounce in weight, four rates of postage.

And for every quarter of an ounce in weight, above the weight of one ounce, there shall be charged and taken one additional rate of postage, and every fraction of a quarter of an ounce shall be charged as an additional quarter of an ounce, and each progressive and additional rate chargeable under this clause shall be estimated and charged at the sum which any such letter would be charged with under this Warrant if not exceeding onequarter of an ounce in weight.

And we do further order and direct, that as to any letter hereinbefore authorised to be sent by the post under the provisions aforesaid, which shall be posted in the United Kingdom, addressed to France or Algeria, the postage thereof shall in every case be paid either in money or by being duly stamped with the proper British postage stamp or stamps affixed thereto, which stamp or stamps shall in every case be affixed or appear on the outside of every such letter near the address, and shall be of the value or amount of the postage duty payable thereupon under or by virtue of this Warrant; and as to every such letter posted in France or Algeria, addressed to the United Kingdom, it is the intention that the postage thereof shall in every case be paid at the time of the same being posted.

And we do further order and direct, that if the postage of any such letter posted in the United Kingdom, addressed to France or Algeria, shall not be duly and properly paid, either in money or by British stamps, when posted; or, if the postage of any such letter posted in France or Algeria, addressed to the United Kingdom, shall not be duly and properly paid when posted, every such letter shall be charged with a postage of double the amount of postage to which it would have been liable under the provisions aforesaid, if the postage thereof had been paid in money or stamps

when posted.

And we do further order and direct that nothing herein contained shall be construed in anywise to annul, prejudice, or affect any of the exemptions and privileges granted by the said recited Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, nor to annul, prejudice, or affect any of the privileges which seamen and soldiers em-ployed in Her Majesty's service, and seamen and soldiers employed in the service of the East India Company, now by law enjoy of sending and receiving by the post letters not exceeding half an ounce in weight, subject to the regulations and restrictions in respect of the same, nor to annul, prejudice, or affect the privilege under which printed newspapers, printed prices current, printed commercial lists, printed courses of exchange, periodical publications, and parliamentary proceedings, may now be forwarded by the post between the United Kingdom or Her Majesty's colonies and France or Algeria, or between the United Kingdom and Her Majesty's colonies or foreign countries through France, subject to the regulations and restrictions in respect of the same, nor to repeal, alter, or affect the provisions of a certain Warrant under the hands of two of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, bearing date the 17th day of May, 1854, as to certain letters transmitted by the post between the United Kingdom and any port or place in Turkey or the Black Sea.

And we do further order and direct that the term "by the post" whenever used in this Warrant, shall, as to the sea conveyance, include the conveyance by packet-boat, British or French, or by private ship, unless it be inconsistent with the context of the clause or provision in which such term shall be found; and that the several other terms and expressions used in this Warrant shall be construed to have the like meaning in all respects as they would have had if inserted in the said Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty.

And we do further order and direct that this Warrant shall come into operation on the first day

of January next.

Provided lastly, and we hereby declare and direct, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners
