NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(Translation.)

Light-houses on the Coasts of Spain.

THE Naval Department has received from the Ministry of Public Works, and has communicated to this Office, for its publication, a notice relative to the situation of a new Light-house erected on

the coasts of the Spanish Peninsula, by the Corps of Engineers of Roads, Canals, and Ports, the description of which is as follows :—

MEDITERRANEAN SEA.

Light-house on Cape San Antonio (Province of Alicante).

FROM the 1st of January, 1855, a new Light-house, erected on the old tower of Cape "San Antonio," will be lighted every night from sunset to sun-rise; the situation of this light is in 38° 48' 31" N. latitude, and 6° 24' 42" E. longitude, from the meridian of the Naval Observatory of "Sn. Fernando."

Its apparatus is of the second catadioptrical order, with a natural light eclipsed every half a minute. The elevation of the light above the level of the sea is of 625·4 feet, and its average range will be of 19 miles, though it will be visible from a greater or minor distance according to the state of the atmosphere and the elevation of the observer.

The Queen has been pleased to give and grant unto Ann Schofield, of Baltic, in the township of Newchurch, in the Forest of Rossendale, in the county of Lancaster, Widow and Relict of James Schofield, late of Baltic aforesaid, Woollen Manufacturer, deceased, on behalf of her only son George William Law, a Minor of the age of fifteen years and upwards, by her former husband Henry Hargreaves Law, late of Newchurch aforesaid, Gentleman, deceased, Her royal licence and authority that her son the said George William Law, may from motives of affectionate respect and regard to the memory of the said James Schofield, as well as in compliance with a proviso contained in his last will and testament, henceforth take and use the surname of Schofield in addition to, and after that of Law :

And also to command that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of postage," power is given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury from time to time, by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British or inland postage payable by law on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters, and to subject the same to rates of postage according to the weight thereof.

And whereas further powers are given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury by an

Act, passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for giving further facilities for the transmission of letters by post and for the regulating the duties of postage thereon, and for other purposes relating to the Post Office."

And whereas it is expedient to alter the rates of postage on the letters hereinafter mentioned.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers vested in us in and by the said before-mentioned Acts, or either of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant (under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, by the authority of the statute in that case made and provided) order and direct that on every letter not exceeding one quarter of an ounce in weight, posted in the United Kingdom, addressed to any port or place in Turkey or the Black Sea, or posted at any port or place in Turkey or the Black Sea, addressed to the United Kingdom and transmitted by the post between any place in the United Kingdom and any port in Turkey or the Black Sea in closed mails via France (the sea conveyance in the Mediterranean being by French packet-boats) there shall be charged, taken, and paid in lieu of any rates of postage now payable by law on such respective letters an uniform British rate of Postage of two-pence.

And that on every letter not exceeding one quarter of an ounce in weight, posted in the United Kingdom, addressed to Alexandria or any other place in Egypt, or posted in Egypt, addressed to the United Kingdom, and transmitted by the post between any place in the United Kingdom and any port in Egypt, via France (the sea conveyance in the Mediterranean being by British packet-boats) there shall be charged, taken, and paid, in lieu of any rates of postage now payable by law on such respective letters, an uniform total rate of postage of one shilling.

And we direct that on every letter transmitted, as is hereinbefore mentioned, exceeding a quarter of an ounce in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid, in lieu of any rates of postage now payable, by law, on such respective letters, progressive and additional rates of postage, as follows; that is to say :

On every letter exceeding a quarter of an ounce in weight, and not exceeding half an ounce in weight, two rates of postage.

On every letter exceeding half an ounce in weight, and not exceeding three quarters of an ounce in weight, three rates of postage.

On every letter exceeding three quarters of an ounce in weight, and not exceeding one ounce in weight, four rates of postage.

And for every quarter of an ounce in weight, above the weight of one ounce, there shall be charged and taken one additional rate of postage, and every fraction of a quarter of an ounce above the weight of one ounce, shall be charged as an additional quarter of an ounce, and each progressive and additional rate chargeable under this clause shall be estimated and charged at the sum which any such letter would be charged with, under the provisions hereinbefore contained, if not exceeding one quarter of an ounce in weight.

And we do further order and direct, that on every letter not exceeding one half an ounce in weight, posted in the United Kingdom, addressed to Alexandria, or any other place in Egypt, or posted in Alexandria, or any other place in Egypt, addressed to the United Kingdom, and transmitted by the post, direct between any place

in the United Kingdom and any port in Egypt, by British packet-boat, viâ Southampton, there shall be charged, taken, and paid in lieu of any rates of postage now payable, by law, on such respective letters, an uniform rate of postage of one shilling.

And we direct, that on every letter transmitted between the United Kingdom and Egypt, as is lastly hereinbefore mentioned, exceeding half an ounce in weight, there shall be charged, taken, and paid in lieu of any rates of postage now payable, by law, on such respective letters, progressive and additional rates of postage as follows; that is to say:

On every letter exceeding half an ounce in weight, and not exceeding one ounce in weight, two rates of postage.

On every letter exceeding one ounce in weight, and not exceeding two ounces in weight, four rates of postage.

On every letter exceeding two ounces in weight, and not exceeding three ounces in weight, six rates of postage.

And for every ounce in weight, above the weight of three ounces, there shall be charged and taken one additional rate of postage, and every fraction of an ounce, above the weight of three ounces, shall be charged as one additional ounce; and each progressive and additional rate chargeable under this clause shall be estimated and charged at the sum of one shilling.

And we do further order and direct, that nothing herein contained shall be construed in anywise to annul, prejudice, or affect any of the exemptions and privileges granted by the said recited Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, nor to annul, prejudice, or affect any of the privileges which seamen and soldiers employed in Her Majesty's service, and seamen and soldiers employed in the service of the East India Company, now by law enjoy, of sending and receiving by the post letters not exceeding half an ounce in weight, subject to the regulations and restrictions in respect of the same, nor to annul, prejudice, or affect any privileges under which printed newspapers, or other printed papers, are now allowed to pass by the post, or to repeal, alter, or affect the provisions of a certain Warrant, under the hands of two of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, bearing date the 17th day of May, 1854, as to certain letters transmitted by the post between the United Kingdom and any port or place in Turkey or the Black Sea.

And we do further order and direct, that the several terms and expressions used in this Warrant shall be construed to have the like meaning in all respects as they would have had if inserted in the said Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty.

And we do further order and direct, that this Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of January next.

Provided lastly, and we hereby declare and direct, that it shall be lawful for the Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury, or any two of them, by Warrant under their hands, at any time hereafter to alter any of the regulations hereby made, and to make and establish any new or other regulations in lieu thereof.
