W HEREAS the Lords of the Council were pleased, by their Order of the 30th day of November last, to prohibit the exportation of Blue Lias, Portland Cement, and other articles commonly used in the manufacture of Marine Cement, to any place north of Dunkirk, their Lordships are hereby pleased to order that the said prohibition, as far as it extends to the articles aforesaid, be, and the same is hereby, rescinded.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Venice, inclosing copy of a Notice to Mariners, a translation of which is subjoined, issued by the authorities at Trieste, relative to a New Floating Beacon that has been placed in the Curzola Channel, in the Adriatic Sea.

#### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

In order to prevent vessels getting ashore on the shoal of Lusnac, lying between the Rock of Badia and the Rock of Lusnac, at the E. entrance of the channel, between the islands of Curzola and Sabioncello, there has been placed over the centre of the shoal, where there is only five feet depth of water, a floating beacon of a quadrangular pyramidal form, the upper part of which is painted red and the lower white.

To avoid the shoal vessels must keep twenty fathoms distant from the beacon.

Field-Marshal Lord Raglan has been requested to forward lists of the individuals entitled to these honourable distinctions.
