James Lay Hart, late of Newton, in the county of Suffolk, out of business, previously of Bentley, in the said county, out of business, before that at lodgings at No. 223, Shore-ditch, in the county of Middlesex, out of business, and formerly of Newtown aforesaid, Miller, and while residing there also carrying on the trade of a Miller, at Oldham, in the county of Suffolk.

Thomas Hatherly, late of Cage-hill, Monkwearmouth, in the county of Durham, Mariner, previously of the same place, Mariner and Owner of the sloop Margaret, of the Port of Sunderland, near the sea, in the said county, and formerly of the same place, Mariner, Fisherman, and Private Lodging-house Keeper (sued as Thomas Hetherley).
