

of the parish of Britford, in the county of Wilts, and in the diocese of Salisbury, it appears to them to be expedient that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of All Saints, situate at East Harnham, in the said parish of Britford, under and by virtue of the power or authority contained in the sixteenth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes,' and in the third section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the second and third years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to make better provision for the assignment of ecclesiastical districts to churches or chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and for other purposes,' and of all other powers in this behalf contained in the Church Building Acts, and that such proposed district should be named 'The District Chapelry of East Harnham,' and that the boundaries thereof should be those hereinafter mentioned; that is to say:

"The boundary follows a line drawn in a southeasterly direction from a point (marked B on the map or plan hereinafter referred to) on the road leading from East Harnham to the Salisbury Race Course, and about one hundred and sixty-five yards distant from the point A (also marked on the said map), where such road joins the Old Blandford Turnpike-road, along a footpath leading into the said Old Blandford Turnpike-road, and from thence along a hedge to the New Blandford Turnpike-road, crossing which it proceeds along the whole length of the hedge of fields, Nos. 287 and 288, to a spot marked C on the said map (distant about three hundred and fifty yards from the highway marked D on the said map, leading to Odstock), from whence it proceeds in a northerly direction along the western fences of fields Nos. 288, 289, 322, 140, and 135, to the northern fence of No. 135; then easterly and southerly along the northern and eastern fences thereof to the footpath leading from East Harnham to Britford, which bounds it for a short distance, on leaving which it proceeds in an easterly direction, along the northern fence of a field No. 143; and then northerly across a stream along a main drain or water-carriage connecting a small branch of the River Avon with the same stream, along which branch it proceeds in a westerly direction to its junction with the River Avon; the district chapelry of East Harnham is then bounded on the north by the said River Avon, and on the west by the parish of West Harnham, as such district chapelry is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereto annexed, and thereon coloured pink.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that it also appears to them to be expedient that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, should be solemnized or performed in All Saints Church, at East Harnham aforesaid, and that the fees to arise therefrom should be paid and belong to the minister or incumbent of such church for the time being.

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Walter Kerr, Bishop of the said diocese of Salisbury, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Acts and sections hereinbefore mentioned, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this representation.

humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto, as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of All Saints, situate at East Harnham, in the parish of Britford, be accordingly made, and that the recommendations of the said Commissioners in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, in the said church, and the fees to arise therefrom, be carried into effect agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like, advice is pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Salisbury.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act passed in the last session of Parliament for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes," and of the third section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the second and third years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the assignment of ecclesiastical districts to churches or chapels augmented by the Governors of the bounty of Queen Anne, and for other purposes," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, in the words following; viz.:
