

653, in the said parish of Eastington, to its junction with the Stroudwater Canal; thence proceeding southwardly along the said canal until it reaches a point opposite to the southern extremity or point of an inclosure, No. 11, in the said parish of Fretherne, thence leaving the canal and crossing the road to the said last-mentioned southern point of the last-mentioned inclosure No. 11; thence in a northern direction along the eastern side of the said last-mentioned inclosure, and another inclosure in the said parish of Fretherne, No. 10, until it reaches opposite to the western part of an inclosure, No. 5, on reaching which it crosses the River Frome; thence eastwardly along the southern fence of No. 5 to the road leading from Saul, and crossing the said road proceeding along its eastern boundary in a northerly direction to an inclosure, No. 28, in the said parish of Saul; thence proceeding along the southern and eastern boundaries of the said last-mentioned inclosure to its junction with a road leading eastwardly to Epney Longney and Gloucester, proceeding along the southern boundary of the said road until it reaches a stream of water at the western boundary of an inclosure, No. 14, in the said parish of Saul (the said stream of water being the boundary of the said last-mentioned inclosure on its western side), along which the boundary line continues in a southerly direction till it reaches another stream which joins the southern boundary of the said last-mentioned inclosure, along which said stream it proceeds, in a northerly and then in an eastwardly direction, by the inclosure, No. 13, and again in a northwardly direction up to the point of junction with the inclosure, No. 11, in the said parish of Saul, proceeding in a north-western direction for a short distance along the eastern side of the said inclosure, No. 11, where it reaches a farm road, crossing which it proceeds in an eastwardly direction to the west point of the southern boundary of the inclosure, No. 3, in the said parish of Whitminster, along which the boundary line proceeds in an eastwardly direction, and in the same direction along the southern boundary of the inclosure, No. 4, in the said parish of Whitminster, thence in a northerly direction along its eastern boundary to its junction with the southern boundary of the aforesaid road leading to Epney Longley and Gloucester, thence the boundary line proceeds in a north-eastwardly direction along the south-eastern boundary of the said road until it reaches its junction with the western corner of the inclosure, No. 24, in the parish of Moreton Valence, thence eastwardly, southerly, and easterly along inclosure No. 24, till it joins inclosure No. 25, then southerly and easterly along the southern boundary of No. 25, until it joins the western boundary of inclosure No. 26, thence southerly and easterly along the southern boundary of inclosure No. 26, up to its junction with a stream at the south-eastern corner of No. 26, following the said stream in a northward direction and passing Nos. 27, 30, and 31, until it reaches its junction with the westwardly point of an inclosure, No. 71, in the said parish of Moreton Valence, thence along the southerly and south-eastern fence of the last-mentioned inclosure to its junction with the Arle Brook, which it follows in a south-eastwardly direction to a point marked thus X on the said plan, then crossing the road in a northwardly direction to the south point of the eastern boundary of the inclosure, No. 72, in the said parish of Moreton Valence, thence northwardly along the eastern fences of the inclosure, No. 72, then north-easterly along the eastern and north-westerly along the northern boundary of inclosure No. 79, to the eastern fence of inclosure

No. 75, proceeding north-easterly along the eastern fences of Nos. 75, 76, and 77, to the eastern part of the northern fence of the said inclosure, No. 77, thence proceeding in a north-western direction along the said northern fence, thence northwardly along the eastern fence of inclosure, No. 55, till it reaches the stream dividing the parish of Moreton Valence from the parish of Longney, thence following the said stream in a westwardly direction to the point where it flows into the River Severn at the point on the said map marked with the letter B, thence it follows the River Severn to the first-mentioned point on the said plan marked with the said letter A, at which the boundary of the said consolidated chapelry of Framilode commenced, and as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured yellow, pink, green, brown, buff, lilac, and red.

"That the consents of the Right Reverend James Henry, Bishop of the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, and patron, in right of his see, of the parish churches of the said parishes of Moreton Valence and Standish; of the Reverend Thomas Murray Browne, Master of Arts, Vicar and Incumbent of the united parishes of Standish cum Hardwicke, in the county of Gloucester, and (as such Vicar and Incumbent) patron of the parish church of the said parish of Saul; of John Sayer, of Arlingham, in the county of Gloucester, Esquire, patron of the parish church of the said parish of Arlingham; of Sir Edward Tierney, of Church Town House, Buttevant, in the county of Cork, Baronet, patron of the parish church of the said parish of Fretherne; of the Reverend Thomas Peters, Bachelor of Arts, of Eastington aforesaid, Clerk, patron (in his own right) of the parish church of the said parish of Eastington; and of George Bengough, of "The Ridge," in the parish of Wootton, in the said county of Gloucester, Esquire, patron of the parish church of the said parish of Whitminster, have been severally obtained to the formation of the said consolidated chapelry of Framilode, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned, in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this representation.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that it has been mutually agreed between the said James Henry, Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, Thomas Murray Browne, John Sayer, Sir Edward Tierney, Thomas Peters, and George Bengough, as such respective patrons as aforesaid, testified as aforesaid (with the approbation of your Majesty's said Commissioners, testified as hereinafter mentioned, and also of the said James Henry, Bishop of the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, testified as aforesaid), that the right of presentation and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to serve the said church at Framilode aforesaid should be vested in, belong to, and whenever occasion may require, be exercised by, the Bishop of the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, for the time being.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the consolidated chapelry therein mentioned for the consecrated church of Saint Peter; situate
