LORD PANMURE has this day received a Despatch and its Enclosures, of which the following are copies, addressed to His Grace the Duke of Newcastle, by Field-Marshal the Lord Raglan, G.C.B.

Before Sevastopol,

MY LORD DUKE, *February 6, 1855.*

I MENTIONED to your Grace on Saturday that the weather had broken. The frost was very severe on that night, and the thermometer down at thirteen, and the wind was very high and piercingly cold.

Sunday was rather milder, and yesterday was fine. To-day the glass has fallen, and there is every appearance of rain.

I am happy to state that the Medical Officers consider that the general condition of the men has improved, although apparently there is no diminution in the number of the sick.

The enemy has made no movement of importance, but great convoys of waggons have been observed to go into Sevastopol laden either with ammunition or provisions.

I enclose the casualties to the 4th instant.

Lieutenant-Colonel Collingwood Dickson, of the Royal Artillery, an excellent officer, whom I have before had occasion to bring to your notice, was slightly wounded on the 4th instant, when making a reconnaissance in company with some French officers.

Light-house on the Coast of Spain, in the Ocean.

INFORMATION having been received in this Department, through the Minister of Marine, by

a communication from the Minister of Public Works, referring to the erection of a new Light-house on the coast of the Spanish Peninsula, by the Corps of Engineers of Roads, Canals, and Ports, the following notice has been drawn up for public information:—

Light-house of Mount Igueldo, Province of Guipuzcoa.

A NEW light will be exhibited every night, from sunset to sunrise, on Mount Igueldo, Port of San Sebastian, on and after the 15th day of March next. This new Light-house will substitute the light, kindled during the winter, from the Castle of La Mota.

The new Light-house is situated to the west of the Bay of San Sebastian, in latitude 43° 19' 28" N., longitude 4° 11' 50" E. of the meridian of the Observatory of San Fernando.

The apparatus is catadioptric, grand model of the 3rd order, producing a fixed light of natural colour, variegated by brilliant flashes every two minutes, and may be seen at a distance of 15 miles and less, according to the state of the atmosphere.

The luminous focus is elevated 468 Castilian feet above the level of the sea.

THE Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give notice, that, on Thursday the 22nd instant, at one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for supplying and delivering into Her Majesty's Victualling Stores at Deptford, the undermentioned articles, viz.:

Wheat, 3,000 quarters; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards, or earlier, if preferred by the party tendering.

Oats 500 quarters; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

Vinegar, 20,000 gallons; half to be delivered in three weeks, and the remainder in three weeks afterwards, or earlier if preferred by the party tendering.

Their Lordships reserve to themselves the power, when the tenders are opened, of contracting either for the whole, or for such part thereof only as they may deem fit, or for a greater quantity, or of not contracting for any; and also an unlimited power of selection.
