

the Camp from the *Turkish* Army, and acquainted the Duke of *Lorrain*, that the Grand Visier had resolv'd to attack our Lines this morning with 8000 *Janissaries*, and to second them with his whole Army, which we the more credited, for that we saw in the Evening the *Turkish* Army moving towards us; We were all Night in a readiness to receive them, but it proved a false Alarm. We have now finish'd a Regular Fort, where are posted 1000 Men, to secure the Valley which the Enemy forced when they put those Men into the Place on the 20th Instant. The last Night a *Turk*, who came out of the Town, was taken swimming in the *Danube*, having a Letter in a little Box about his Neck, the Contents whereof was, That the *Bassa* refer'd all he had to communicate to the Visier to the Bearer, who would do it best by word of mouth, which makes us believe they are in a very ill condition in the Town; He will be put to the Torture, to make him confess the Message he was charged with; 6000 Horse of Lieutenant-General *Sherffenberg's* Forces will arrive in the Camp this Evening, and he himself is expected with the Foot in two or three days. In the mean time we go on very vigorously with our Mines, with filling up the Ditch, and with other Preparations for another General Assault.

Vienna, Sept. 3. It has, at length, pleas'd the Divine Providence to bless the Christian Arms with the Conquest of the Famous Forts of *Buda*, which was taken yesterday, by Assault, in the sight of the *Ottoman* Army, after a Siege of two months and ten days. All the Particulars we yet know of this Glorious Action (the Expresses that brought hither the News of it, having parted from the Camp immediately after the Place was taken) are, That yesterday, between two and three in the Afternoon, the *Imperialists*, *Bavarians* and *Brandenburgers* made an Assault from their several Attacks with that Resolution and Bravery, that notwithstanding the Enemies desperate Resistance, they mounted the Breaches, and forcing whatever oppos'd them in less than an hours time, entered the Town, which they did first on the side of the Duke of *Lorrain's* Attack, where Twelve pieces of Cannon plant'd on Two Batteries, had beat down the Flanks of the Retrenchments, which the Besieged had rais'd behind the Breach, and caus'd so great a disorder among the Enemy, that they were at last forc'd to abandon them. The Christians having thus open'd their way, with no great Loss on their side, advanced, without any fear of the Mines they had been threat'n'd with into the most dangerous places of the Town, putting all they found in Arms to the Sword. The *Bassa* of *Buda*, with the Officers and Soldiers that remain'd retir'd into a Redoubt between the Town and the Castle, where they put out a White Flag, and begg'd for Quarter. The Duke of *Lorrain*, who, during the whole Action, supported his Men with his presence, mounted the Breach on Horseback, and having posted the Troops he thought necessary in several parts of the Town, left the farther direction of things there to the Elector of *Bavaria*, and went to give the necessary Orders to the Army which was engag'd with some Detachements the Grand Visier had caus'd to advance towards our Camp, whereof we expect every Minute a farther Account, as well as a more particular Relation of the taking of this important Bulwark of the *Ottoman* Empire.

Hamburg, Sept. 3. The 31 past, the Danish Foot appear'd in sight of this City, as their Horse had done the day before; Upon their Approach we fir'd upon them with our Cannon and Lieutenant-Colonel Eberancke was sent out with 100 Horse, who returned with some Prisoners. The same day 2000 *Lunenburgh* Foot, and 300 Horse, engag'd into the Town, where there is now a very good Garrison. Yesterday the Danes began to attack the Fort call'd the star, making formal Approaches to cover themselves

against our Cannon. We are told that the Elector of *Brandenburg* has sent to the King of *Denmark* to desire him to withdraw his Forces; And that his Electoral Highness, as well as the *Princes* of *Lunenburgh*, have promis'd to assist this City, in case things come to Extremity.

Brussels, Sept. 10. On Sunday last, in the Afternoon, the happy News of the taking of *Buda* by Assault was brought hither in 6 days, by a Trumpeter belonging to the Prince de Vaudemont, who being dispatch'd so soon as the Place was taken, we know yet very few Particulars. He says, the Town was enter'd by the Breach at the Duke of *Lorrain's* Attack by 200 Grenadiers, followed by 60 Volunteers, and 60 command'd Men out of each Regiment; And that when he parted, the Duke of *Lorrain* was encamping 8000 Men at the Foot of the Wall of the Town. Our Governor General having immediately dispatch'd Expresses to *England*, *Spain* and *Holland*, went attended by all the Nobility and Generals on Horseback, and the Ministers and Council of State in their Coaches to *Notre-Dame de Saken*, to render Thanks to God for this Signal and Glorious Success of the Imperial and Auxiliary Terms; That Night the whole City seem'd but one Bonfire, and the rejoicing and feasting was so general, that there were even Tables spread in the Streets; which still continues, and no Shops have yet been open'd since the Arrival of this Express. To-morrow the Magistrates of this City will entertain his Excellency and the whole Court at the Town-house. We have Advice that the City of *Hamburg* is besieg'd by the Forces of the King of *Denmark*.

Paris, Sept. 11. Yesterday arriv'd here an Express, with the News that *Buda* was taken the 2d Instant by Assault. The Letters from *Spain* bring Advice of the arrival of the Galeons at *Cadix* very richly laden.
