the Camp from the Turbifb Army, and acquainted the Duke of Lorrain, that the Grand Vifier had refolved to attack our Lines this morning with 8900 Janifaries, and to fecond them with his whole Army, which we the more credited, for that we faw in the Evening the Tin kifb Army moving towards us; We were all Night in_a readinefs to receive them, but it proved a falle Alarm. We have now finisheda Regular Foit, where are posted 1000Men, to fecure the Valley which the Enemy forced when they put those Men into-the Place on the 20th Inftant. The laft Night a Turk, who came out of the Town, was taken fwimming in the Danube, having a Letter in a little Box about his Neck, the Contents whereof was, That the Baffa referred all he had to communicate to the Vifier to the Bearer, who would do it belt by word of mouth, which makes us believe they are in a very ill condition in the Town ; He will be put to the Torture, to make him confets the Meffage he was charged with ; 6000 Horfe of Lieutenant-General Sherffenberg's Forces will arrive in the Camp this Evening, and he himfelf is expected with the Foot in two or three days. In the mean time we go on very vigoroufly with our Mines, with filling up the Ditch, and with other Preparations for another General Affault.

Vienna, Sept. 3. It has, at length, pleafed the Divine Providence to blefs the Chriftian Arms with the Conqueit of the Famous Fortiels of Buda, which was taken yefterday, by Affault, in the fight of the Otreman Army, after a Siege of two months and ten days. All the Particulars we yet know of this Glorious Action (the Expresses that brought hither the News of it, having parted from the Camp immediately after the Place was taken) are, That yefterday, between two and three in the Afternoor, the Imperialist, Bautrians and Brandenharghers made an Affai it from their feveral Attacks with that Refolution and Bravery, that notwithstanding the Fnemies desperate Resiltance, they mounted the Breaches, and ionging whatever opposed them in lefs than an hours time, entred the Town , which they did first on the fide of the Duke of Lerram's Attack , where Twelve pieces of Cannon planted on Two Batteries, had beat down the Flanks of the Retrenchments, which the Be-fieged had raifed behind the Breach, and caufed fo great & diforder among the Enemy, that they were at last forced to abandon them. The Chriflians having thos opened their way, with no great Loss on their fide, advanced, without any fear of the Mines they had been threatned with into the most dangerous places of the Town, putting all they found in Arms to the Sword. The Balla of Buda, with the Officers and Soldiers that remained retired into a Redoubt between the Town and the Cattle, where they put out a White Flag, and beggedfor Quarter. The Duke of Louranh, who, during the whole Action, supported his Men with his prefence, mounted the Breach on Horfeback, and having pofted the Troops be thought neceffary in feveral parts of the Town, left the farther direction of things there to the Elector of Bavaria, and went to give the neceffary Orders to the Army which was engaged with fome Detachements the Grand Vifier had cauted to advance towards our Camp, whereof we expect every Minute a farther Account, 'as, well as a more particular Relation of the taking of this important Bulwark of the Ottoman Empire
