Increase of Borrowing Powers of Corporation of Wisbech—Guarantee by Municipal Estates and Borough Fund and Rates of Sums borrowed on Harbour Tolls for paying Contributions by Wisbech—Power to pay Interest on Sums borrowed, and to form Sinking Fund out of Borough Fund and Rates if Harbour Tolls insufficient—Power to Levy Borough Rates—Amendment of Acts.
