The Queen has been pleased to grant unto Eliza Gulston, of Llanelly, in the county of Carmarthen, and of Lower Berkeley-street, Portmansquare, in the county of Middlesex, Spinster, only daughter of the late Joseph Gulston, of Ealinggrove, in the said county of Middlesex, Esquire, sometime representative in Parliament for the borough of Poole, deceased, by Elizabetha Bridgetta his wife, daughter of Sir Thomas Stepney, of Llanelly aforesaid, Baronet, and sister of Sir John Stepney, of the same place, Baronet, also deceased, Her Majesty's royal licence and authority that she may henceforth assume, take, and use the surname of Stepney, in addition to and after that of Gulston, and that she may bear the arms of Stepney, in order to testify her grateful and affectionate regard for the memory of her maternal uncle; the said Sir John Stepney, Baronet, and to manifest her respect for her maternal ancestors, such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office, otherwise the said licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

Boston Union.—Boston Parish.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the parish of Boston, in the county of Lincoln;—

To the Clerk or Clerks to the Justices of the Petty Sessions held for the division or divisions in which the said parish is situate;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Boston, in the county of Lincoln, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons:

And whereas at a meeting of the Vestry, held at the Vestry Room of the Parish Church, after public notice in that behalf, on Thursday the fifteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, it was resolved,—

“That in the opinion of this Vestry, it is highly desirable to carry into immediate effect so much of the provisions of a certain Act of Parliament, made and passed in the 13th and 14th years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled ‘An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the appointment of Vestry Clerks,’ as prohibits the holding of any Vestry or other Meeting in the Parish Church, or the Vestry Room attached thereto; and that for this purpose the Churchwardens be hereby authorized to make the necessary application to the Commissioners for administering the laws for the relief of the poor in England, in order that so much of the said recited Act may be applied to, and put in force within, this parish.”

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above recited resolution.

Now, therefore, we, the said Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, do hereby order and direct, that so much of the Act aforesaid as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings, for the purpose of holding vestry or other meetings for the transaction of any business of or relating to the said parish of Boston, shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within, the said parish.

And we direct, that a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
