"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent that, having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Cheltenham, in the county of Gloucester, and in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, it appears to them to be expedient that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Luke, at Sandford, in the said parish of Cheltenham, under the power for that purpose contained in the sixteenth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and ren-'der more effectual an Act passed in the last session of Parliament for building and pro-'moting the building of additional churches in 'populous parishes,' and also in the third section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the second and third years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to make better provision for the assign-ment of ecclesiastical districts to churches or chapels, augmented by the Governors of the 'bounty of Queen Anne, and for other purposes,' and that such proposed district should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Luke, Cheftonham,' and that the boundaries thereof shou'd be those hereinafter mentioned; that is to say:

"The boundary line of the said district chapelry of Saint Luke, Cheltenham, commences in the High-street, or London-road, at the north-eastern end of Cambray-place, and proceeds southwesterly along the middle of Cambray-place into Rodney-terrace, then along the middle of Rodneyterrace to the southern end thereof, then proceeds easterly to the northern end of Victoria-walk or road, then south-westerly along the middle of Victoria-walk or road, and also of Montpelierparade until it reaches Montpelier-terrace, then easterly along the middle of Montpelier-terrace as far as Bath-road, then southerly along the middle of Bath-road, to the point where the boundary line of the parishes of Cheltenham and Leckhampton cross the said road opposite the Norwood Arms Inn, and from such point proceeds in a south-easterly and easterly direction along the boundary line of the said parishes of Cheltenham and Leckhampton until they meet the boundary line of the parish of Charlton Kings, and then proceeds northerly along such boundary line as the High-street, Cheltenham, then proceeds in the second and third years of Her Majesty's

north-westerly along the middle of the Highstreet as far as Cambray-place, where the boundary line of the said district chapelry of Saint Luke, Cheltenham, commenced, and as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereto annexed, and is thereon coloured lilac.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent that it also appears to them to be expedient that banns of marriage should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, and churchings, should be solemnized or performed in the said church of Saint Luke, at Sandford aforesaid, and that the fees to arise therefrom should be received for, on account of, and paid over to, the Reverend Francis Close, Master of Arts, Incumbent of the parish church of the said parish of Cheltenham, during his incumbency thereof, and that from and after his avoidance of such incumbency, the said fees should belong to the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said church of Saint Luke, at Sandford aforesaid.

"That the consent of the Right Reverend James Henry, Bishop of the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Acts and sections hereinbefore mentioned, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this representation.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Luke, at Sandford, in the parish of Cheltenham, be accordingly made, and that the recommendations of the said Commissioners, in respect of the publication of banns, and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, and churchings, in the said church, and the fees to arise therefrom, be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol.

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent that having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of St. Chad, Shrewsbury, in the county of Salop, and in the diocese of Lichfield, it appears to them to be expedient that a particular district should be assigned to the consecrated church called Christ Church, situate in the township of Shelton and Oxon, in the said parish of St. Chad, Shrewsbury, under and by virtue of the power or authority contained in the sixteenth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an ' Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes,' and in the third section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the second and third years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to make better provision for 'the assignment of ecclesiastical districts to ' churches or chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and for other purposes,' and that such proposed district should consist of such parts of the township of Shelton and Oxon as are in the said parish of St. Chad, together with the township of Woodcote and Horton, and the township of Crow Meole, including two detached portions of such first-mentioned township of Shelton and Oxon, which are entirely surrounded by the parish of St. Julian, Shrewsbury, and which said several townships and portions form the south-westernmost part of the said parish of St. Chad, Shrewsbury, and which proposed district should be named or called 'the 'District Chapelry of Shelton and Oxon, Shrews-'bury' and that the boundaries thereof should be those hereinafter mentioned; that is to say:

"Such district chapelry is bounded on the north-east by the said parish of St. Chad, and the district of St. George, on the east and partly on the south by the parish of Meole Brace, on other part of the south by the parish of Hanwood, on the south-west by the parish of Pontesbury, and on the north-west and north by the district of Bicton, as the said district chapelry of Christ Church, Shelton and Oxon, Shrewsbury, is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereto annexed, and is thereon coloured pink.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent that it also appears to them to be expedient that banns of marriage should be published and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed in the said church called Christ Church; and that the fees to arise therefrom should be paid and belong to the minister or incumbent of such church for the time being.

"That the consent of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Acts and sections hereinbefore mentioned, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this representation.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your royal wisdom, shall seem meet."

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the ninth section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the "further amendment of the Church Building "Acts," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, in the words following; viz.:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent that having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the united parishes of Saint Olave and Saint Giles, and of the parishes of Saint Maurice and Saint Michael-le-Belfrey, in the city and county of York, and in the diocese of York, it appears to them to be expedient to unite and consolidate certain contiguous portions of the said parishes, and to form the same into one consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, for the consecrated church of Saint Thomas, situate in the Groves, in the said united parishes of Saint Olave and Saint Giles York, under the power for such purpose contained in the ninth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act 'for the further amendment of the Church Building 'Acts,' and that such proposed consolidated chapelry should be named or called 'The Con solidated Chapelry of Saint Thomas York,' and that the boundaries thereof should be those hereinafter mentioned; that is to say: commencing in Clarence-street, in the suburbs of the city of York, at the west end of the house belonging to Mr. Richard Meek, and in the occupation of Mr. John Watson; then proceeding in a north-westerly direction along the boundary of the said Richard

Meek's property, and the boundary of certain property belonging to the said Richard Meek and George Meek, Thomas Snow, George Rickaby, George Meek, Thomas Snow, George Rickaby, and William Winspear, as far as a field belonging to the late Reverend William Leonard Pickard, deceased; then turning in a northerly direction, and pursuing the boundary between the property of the said late Reverend William Leonard Pickard and the Governors of the York County Lunatic Asylum on the one side, and the property of the various owners of Union-terrace on the other side, as far as the public footpath behind the said asylum, called the Asylum-lane; then pursuing such lane in a westerly direction as far as the public road called Burton-lane; then turning north-easterly along the middle of Burton-lane as far as the gate opening on the public footpath leading across the fields of Benjamin Dodsworth, Esquire, at the west side of his house, called Burton Grange, and pursuing such footpath until it reaches an occupation-road leading into a public road, called Water-lane, in or near a field belonging to the Right Honourable Earl De Grey, and in the occupation of George Houlgate, then pursuing the said occupation-road to the corner of the pinfold where such occupation-road leads into Water-lane aforesaid; and then along the middle of Water-lane in a northerly direction to the public road called Kettlestring-lane; and then turning north-easterly along the middle of Kettlestring-lane to the York and Oswaldkirk Turnpikeroad; from this point, turning south and southeasterly, and pursuing the existing boundary between the township of Clifton and the township of Huntington, in the North Riding, and the said township of Clifton and the township of Heworth, in the same riding, as far as one of the boundarystones of the parish of Saint Maurice aforesaid, near Grove-terrace, at the River Foss; then turning westwards and pursuing the existing boundary between the parish of Saint Maurice and the township of Clifton aforesaid, to the west end of a small plantation at the back of Grove-terrace; then turning southerly along the west end of such plantation as far as the public footpath across the field in front of Grove House, formerly belonging to the late Robert Cattle Esquire, deceased; and at such footpath turning south-westerly, and pursuing the middle of the same footpath as far as Penley Grove-street, and along the middle of Penley Grove-street, north-westerly, as far as the northern boundary of the property belonging to the trustees of Mrs. Harrison's Hospital, and turning south-westerly along such northern boundary as far as the north-eastern boundary of the property belonging to the proprietors of the York and Ripon Diocesan Training School and Yeoman School, and pursuing such boundary in a northwesterly direction as far as the boundary separating the township of Clifton from the parish of Saint Maurice; then pursuing such boundary in a south-westerly direction as far as the boundary between the parish of Saint Giles and the township of Clifton, and pursuing such last-mentioned boundary in a north-westerly direction as far as the north-western boundary of the property of the said proprietors of the said school; then turning south-westerly as far as a house belonging to, and in the occupation of, Mr. John Ward, in a newformed street, called De Grey-street, and turning to the north-west at the eastern boundary of such last-mentioned house, as far as the middle of De Grey-street; then turning south-westerly along the middle of De Grey-street to the middle of another new street now forming, called Jamesstreet, leading from De Grey-street aforesaid to Clarence-street, and turning along the middle of

James-street, in a north-westerly direction, as far as Clarence-street aforesaid; and thence in a straight line, in a westerly direction, to the west end of the said house belonging to the said Richard Meek, and in the occupation of the said John Watson, at the point where the boundary of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Thomas York commenced, and as the same is more particularly delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured pink, blue, and green.

"That the consents of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Thomas, Archbishop of the said diocese of York, and also patron, in right of his see, of the parish church of the said parish of Saint Maurice York, of the Right Honourable Thomas Philip Weddell, Earl De Grey, patron of the parish church of the said united parishes of Saint Olave and Saint Giles York, and of the dean and chapter of the cathedral church of York, patrons of the parish church of the said parish of Saint Michael-le-Belfrey York, have been severally obtained to the formation of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Thomas York, as required by the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned, in testimony whereof the said Thomas, Archbishop of York, and Thomas Philip Weddell, Earl de Grey, have signed and sealed this representation, and the said dean and chapter have hereto affixed their common seal,

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent, that it has been mutually agreed between the said Thomas, Archbishop of York. Thomas Philip Weddell, Earl De Grey, and the said dean and chapter, as such respective patrons as aforesaid, testified as aforesaid (with the approbation of your Majesty's said Commissioners, testified as hereinafter mentioned, and of the said Thomas, Archbishop of York, testified as aforesaid, that the right of presentation and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to serve the said church of Saint Thomas in the Groves aforesaid should be vested in, belong to, and whenever occasion may require, be exercised by, the Archbishop of York for the time being.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your royal wisdom shall seem meet."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map or plan thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the consolidated chapelry therein mentioned for the consecrated church of Saint Thomas, situate in the Groves, in the united parishes of Saint Olave and Saint Giles York, be accordingly formed, and that the agreement mentioned in the said representation in respect of the right of presentation and appointment of an incumbent or perpetual curate to serve the said church be carried into effect, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act; and that the right of presentation and nomination to the said church shall be vested ir, belong to, and be exercised by, the Archbishop of York for the time being, he being the person mentioned in such representation; and Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of York.
