Hague, Sept. 13. Co Monday last the Count of Commer, Privoy from Span, received by an Express from Billies, the good News of the taking of Bula by Assult the 2d of this Month, which he immediately communicated to the States General rel, and to ell-the Foreign Ministers refiding here; And fent a Courier with it to the Prince of Orange, who returned to Dieren the day before. The Baron Coneche Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Dennark, both preferted a Memorial to the States General, to acquaint them with the Motives that have induced his Majelty to come with his Forces be-fore the City of Hamburgh. The last Letters from those Parts, which are of the 10th Instant, give great hopes that things will be amicably compoled.

Hague, Scat, 1-3. We have this Evening, by the ordinary Post from Germany, Letters from divers places, which give the following Account; That the 29 past, 3000 Turki leconded by 2000 Tartars, attempted a gain to break into the Imperial Camp, and to put Succors into the Town, but that they were repulsed, above 1000 of the Enemy being slain upon the place, and several Colonis taken; I hat towards Night 200 Januaries made another Tiyal to get into the Town; but were all ent off; That the next day Lieutenant-General Scherffenberg arrived in the Camp, that thereupon it was resolved, after his Froops had somewhat rested themselves, to storm the place the 2d Instant, which was accordingly done about Pour in the Afternoon, and that after a Fight of about an hour, the Impersacifis, the Duke of Lorrain Leading them on himfelf, made theirfelves Martors on the Biench, and entied the Towns driving the Efterny before them and purting all they

niet to the Sword. The Bavarians, in the niean time, likewise entied the Town on the fide of the Caltie, and gave QI rtci to noise, sexcept Women and Children, and some Offices and Soldiers who had got into a Redoubtable tween the Town and the Caltle; That the Duke of Lorram having posted several Troops in the Town, went to the Aimy, intending to match with all his Cavalry and Dragoons to follow the Grand Visier, who began to Decamp to foon as he knew the Town was taken; And that at the fame time his Highness had difpatched feveral Expresses to the Imperial Forces in Croatit, to march with all the diligence they could

towards the Bridge of Effecte.

Br ffe's, 5' t. 13. Our Letters from Vidana of the fourth inftant, give this farther account of the taking of Buda; That the fecond inftant in the morning, the Duke of Lorrain having held a Council of War to consult whether they should hirch out and fight the Enemy, or storm the Town, the latter was agreed on; That accordingly the Affault was made about four in the afternoon, during which goodo Hoise were drawn without the Lines to face the Grand Visiers Aimy; That our Cannon having ruined all the Enemies Defences, the Imperialists entred the Town at the Breach on the side of the Duke of Lorrain's Attack, where the Baffa of Buda was killed defending it; upon which the Turks fled, and all that were in Arms were put? to the Sword, and the Pillage of the Town was given to the Soldiers; about 200 Christians were killed in the Assault; The Vice-Bassa, with some 1800. Officers and Soldiers retired within a Retrenchment? and yielded upon Discreticn to the Elector of Bavaria; There were found in the Town 500 Pieces of Cannon; and 22 Mortars; The Garison was before the Affault reduced to 1200 Men. We expecteevery hour a Courier with an exact and particular Re-lation of the great Action. We have advice that the Crons lave taken and plundered Costaniez, a very important place scituated on the River Enna. The 11th Te Deum was fung here for the taking of Bude, at which our Governor-General, the Nobility, Council, Magistrates, &cc. assisted, and the day concluded with Bonfires, Fireworks, and other publick ,1, expressions of joy.
