"and that it should not be lawful for such Con-"sul-General, Consul, or Vice-Consul to levy a "larger fee for this service."

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the fees mentioned in the tables to the said Act annexed, and in the said Order in Council of the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and to establish and authorize the payment of other fees in lieu thereof: Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act and in exercise of the powers in Her Majesty in Council, in that behalf vested by the said Act, it is hereby ordered by Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the several fees mentioned in the tables to the said Act annexed, and in the said Order in Council of the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and fiftyone, shall be abolished, and that the several fees mentioned in the table hereunto annexed for the several matters mentioned therein, shall be substituted for the fees so abolished, and shall and may be taken accordingly, subject to the directions and restrictions contained in the notes appended to the said table.

And the Right Honourable the Earl of Clarendon, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
