THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Bilbao, forwarding the enclosed Notification, issued by the Spanish Board of Health, affecting masters of British vessels which arrive in Port Santander.

(Translation.)

It is enacted by the Sanitary Law that every vessel which arrives at a port of the Peninsula from a foreign port, not having a Bill of Health, incurs a fine of 1100 reals of Vellon, and a fine of 200 Reals when the Bill of Health is not countersigned by the Spanish Consul resident at the port of departure of the vessel.

And as it has been observed at this port that in many recent instances British vessels have contravened these regulations, and as I am desirous to guard against further abuses, and that in the strict fulfilment of the law, the observance of which is confided to me, no further questions may arise on the plea of ignorance—which in sound principles would not exempt the infractor from responsibility,—I have deemed it expedient to address you, in order that you may take such steps as you may consider proper to make the above known to the British mercantile community; and further, that it is to be borne in mind, that in such cases where there may be no Spanish Consul or Agent residing at the port of the vessel's departure, the magistrate of the place by whom the Bill of Health is granted must certify that fact.

I request you will acknowledge the receipt of this communication.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Acapulco, transmitting the enclosed translation of a Decree issued by the Mexican Government, granting certain advantages to whaling vessels which may enter the port of Acapulco.

IGNACIO COMONFORT, Governor and Commandant-General of the Department of Guerrero, to its inhabitants be it known, that the following decree has been forwarded to him by his Excellency General Alvarez, &c.

Art. 1st.—While ships of all friendly nations are permitted to enter and winter in the port of Acapulco, keeping their cargo on board, without being subject to tonnage dues or to any other expenses but those mentioned in this decree.

Art. 2nd.—The fees for the captain of the port pilot-boat and bill of health will be the same for whalers as those exacted from other vessels

under the existing regulations, but as respects their draught of water, one dollar two rials only will be exacted per foot both on entering and leaving the port.

Art. 3rd.—During the time said vessels remain in port they will be subject to the regulations of the maritime custom-house.

Art. 4th.—The owners, captains, consignees, or agents of this class of vessels are permitted to deposit in the port of Acapulco the oil, whalebone, ivory, and all other articles pertaining to their business, without payment of any duty, provided the same are not sold, in which case they will pay a duty of ten per cent. (10 per cent.) on the survey made of the said articles by the administrator of the custom-house, the surveyor, and two of the principal merchants of the port.

Art. 5th.—No impediment shall be placed in the way of these vessels to their obtaining provisions, water, or anything that may be necessary for repairs.

Art. 6th.—This decree will be subject to the revision of the supreme government that may hereafter be established, according to the plan of Ayutla.

Therefore I command that it be printed, published, circulated, and fulfilled.

THE Board of Health of this kingdom having observed that, notwithstanding the repeated

instructions to the contrary, Consuls continue to issue bills of health, leaving the number of passengers in each ship in blank, thereby provoking more rigorous sanitary measures than otherwise would be required, and causing to crews, passengers, merchants, and others, unnecessary embarrassments, hereby make known that, according to the sanitary regulations now in force, all passengers, crew, and cargo of every vessel without a bill of health, stating in full the number of such passengers and crew, will be subject to quarantine and to the corresponding sanitary precautions. And in order that this may be known to those interested, and that they may claim from the Portuguese Consulates the exact form in making out the necessary documents, this present notice is published.

THE President of the Republic determines and decrees:

Art. 1.—The exportation of cigars manufactured in the licensed manufactories of the republic is free of duty.

Art. 2.—The manufactures of cigars which in form, size, and other qualities, approach nearest to Havanna cigars, shall receive a premium of four rials per thousand cigars; and the manufacturers of such as have not these qualifications, but are well adapted for commerce, shall receive a premium of two rials per thousand cigars, and shall be recognized as competent persons.

Art. 3.—The office of the Collector-General shall pay the premiums established in the previous Art., on presentation of a certificate of the Captain of the Port of the embarkation of the cigars.

Art. 4.—A duty of fifteen per cent. is imposed on the exportation of all kinds of tobacco; the present duty of ten per cent. being hereby abolished.

Let this decree be duly communicated, and, in order that it may be known to all, let it be publicly announced in the usual form, and officially published in the *Semanario de Avisos*.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Lighthouses on the Ocean Coasts of Spain.

THE Ministry of Marine has communicated to this office, through the Minister of Foreign Affairs, some information relative to the situation of a new lighthouse, established on the coasts of the Spanish Peninsula, by the Corps of Engineers of Roads, Canals, and Ports, according to which the following notice has been drawn up.

Lighthouse in the Port of Gijon.

(Province of Oviedo.)

This lighthouse, established near the Hermitage of Santa Catalina, will be lighted from the 15th of June this year; its situation is as follows:—

43° 35' 13" N. latitude, and

00° 34' 14" E. longitude from the Naval Observatory of San Fernando.

The elevation of the luminous focus above the level of the sea, the light being a natural and permanent one, is of 183 feet (50 mètres and 95 centimètres), and its range extends to 10 miles.
