horsal, situated near the Black-Sea, and after the taking of that place, (which will be of very great importance to the Crown of Poland, for that it will hinder the Incurious of the Tartars) to put his Troops into Winter-Quarters in Moldavia.

Ritisbinne, Sept. 14. Yesterday Te Deum was fun, in the Cathedral Church of this City, for the happy foccess of the Christian Arms in the taking of Buda. The last Letters from Hungary inform tis, that the Duke of Larrain purfued the Grand Visier with the Imperial Cavalry, and part of the Infantity, having fent the rest with his Cannon by water towards the Bridge of Effecke.

Brimen, Sept. 18. The Princes of Linenburg are, fill at II roung. Their Forces march towards the place appointed for their Encampment, and will

make together a body of 10000 Men.
Bortin, Sopt. 19. The Duke of Lorrain has written to our Elector, to give high an account of the gallant behaviour of his Troops; as during the whole Siege, fo particularly in the last Assault when the Town was taken." The Sieur Revendau, Envoye Extraordinary from the King of Denmarke had this Morning a private Audience of his Electoral Highness, concerning the Affairs of Hamburg; after which, an Express was dispatched to the Sieur Fucks, who is now at the Court of Denmarke. His Electoral Highness has fent several Troops to the affifiance of that City, and others are ready to follow if there be occasion.

Hamburg, Sept. 20. The 16th Instant in the Evening the Sieur Fucks returned hither from the Danish Camp, and acquainted the Senate, that the King had, in confideration of his Malter the Elector of Brandenburg, promifed to withdraw his Forces. The 17th we understood that his Majesty had fent his heavy Cannon and Mortars by water to Gluckfladt, and the rest of his Artillery to Rensburg. The 18th the Danish Forces quitted the Works they hall made against the Sternscans, and marched to Emfbuttell, about half a German mile from hence where they encamped. The fame day arrived here an Express from Vienna, bringing Imperial Monttoria for the King of Denmark to retire from before this City; as likewife Avocatoria, which, if his Majesty does not withdraw his Troops, are to be executed by the King of Sweden, the Elector of Brandenburg; and the Princes of Lunenburg. Yeflerday the Deputies of thi City attended the King agon. It was proposed to them, That this City should pay his Majesty 300 000 Crowns ; That their Ships which have been carried to Gluckstadt should be thereupon restored, with the liberty of their Trade and Commerce; And that the point of the Homage should be referred to Arbitrators. The Senate and Burghers were this day affembled to confider of these Proposals, and resolved not to give any Money. In the mean time the Ministers continue to employ their good Offices for the bringing these matters to an amicable conclusion Jastram and Schmitger were this day brought to their Tryal, the Fifchal demanding that they should be punished as I raitors.

Hague, Sept. 24. The States General have appointed Commissioners to enter into conference with the Envoy from the Emperor of Meracco. Four Men of War will be fent to the Elbe, in case the differences between the King of Denmark and the City of Hamburg he not speedily composed, to protect our Merchant Ships from being visited or otherwife molested. The Heer Van Dieft and the Sieur

Raule the Brandenburg Ministers have frequent Conferences with the Deputies of the States General, and those of the Admiralties about the Trade of Africa. The Letters from Vienna of the 12th Instant tell us, That the Duke having sent most of his Infantry with 30 pieces of Cannon down the Danube, marchest the 6th Inflant with the rest of the Army after the Grand Visier who retired in great hafte and disorder towards the Bridge of Effecke. They write from Hamburg that the King of Denmark has withdrawn his Forces from before that City, and fent his Cannon and Mortars to Gluckstadt; The 12th his Majesty caused all the Artilleng of his Camp, and Ships in the Elbe, to be thrice discharged for the taking of Buda.
