

Agout, situated near the *Black-Sea*, and after the taking of that place, (which will be of very great importance to the Crown of *Poland*, for that it will hinder the Incurfions of the Tartars) to put his Troops into Winter-Quarters in *Moldavia*.

Rittsbiume, Sept. 14. Yesterday *Te Deum* was sung in the Cathedral Church of this City, for the happy success of the Christian Arms in the taking of *Buda*. The last Letters from *Hungary* inform us, that the Duke of *Lorrain* pursued the Grand Visier with the Imperial Cavalry, and part of the Infantry, having sent the rest with his Cannon by water towards the Bridge of *Essecke*.

Bremen, Sept. 18. The Princes of *Lunenburg* are still at *Hamburg*. Their Forces march towards the place appointed for their Encampment, and will make together a body of 20000 Men.

Berlin, Sept. 19. The Duke of *Lorrain* has written to our Elector, to give him an account of the gallant behaviour of his Troops; as during the whole Siege, so particularly in the last Assault when the Town was taken. The *Sieur Revenclau*, Envoye Extraordinary from the King of *Denmarke* had this Morning a private Audience of his Electoral Highness, concerning the Affairs of *Hamburg*; after which, an Express was dispatched to the *Sieur Fucks*, who is now at the Court of *Denmarke*. His Electoral Highness has sent several Troops to the assistance of that City, and others are ready to follow if there be occasion.

Hamburg, Sept. 20. The 16th Instant in the Evening the *Sieur Fucks* returned hither from the Danish Camp, and acquainted the Senate, that the King had, in consideration of his Majesty the Elector of *Brandenburg*, promised to withdraw his Forces. The 17th we understood that his Majesty had sent his heavy Cannon and Mortars by water to *Gluckstadt*, and the rest of his Artillery to *Rensburg*. The 18th the Danish Forces quitted the Works they had made against the *Sternscans*, and marched to *Embsburtell*, about half a German mile from hence, where they encamped. The same day arrived here an Express from *Vienna*, bringing Imperial *Monitors* for the King of *Denmark* to retire from before this City; as likewise *Avocatoria*, which, if his Majesty does not withdraw his Troops, are to be executed by the King of *Sweden*, the Elector of *Brandenburg*, and the Princes of *Lunenburg*. Yesterday the Deputies of this City attended the King again. It was proposed to them, That this City should pay his Majesty 300 000 Crowns; That their Ships which have been carried to *Gluckstadt* should be thereupon restored, with the liberty of their Trade and Commerce; And that the point of the Homage should be referred to Arbitrators. The Senate and Burghers were this day assembled to consider of these Proposals, and resolved not to give any Money. In the mean time the Ministers continue to employ their good Offices for the bringing these matters to an amicable conclusion. *Justram* and *Schniger* were this day brought to their Trial, the Fiscal demanding that they should be punished as Traitors.

Hague, Sept. 24. The States General have appointed Commissioners to enter into conference with the Envoy from the Emperor of *Mexaco*. Four Men of War will be sent to the *Elbe*, in case the differences between the King of *Denmark* and the City of *Hamburg* be not speedily composed, to protect our Merchant Ships from being visited or otherwise molested. The Heer Van *Diest* and the *Sieur*

Raule the *Brandenburg* Ministers have frequent Conferences with the Deputies of the States General, and those of the Admiralties about the Trade of *Africa*. The Letters from *Vienna* of the 12th Instant tell us, That the Duke having sent most of his Infantry with 30 pieces of Cannon down the *Danube*, marched the 6th Instant with the rest of the Army after the Grand Visier who retired in great haste and disorder towards the Bridge of *Essecke*. They write from *Hamburg* that the King of *Denmark* has withdrawn his Forces from before that City, and sent his Cannon and Mortars to *Gluckstadt*; The 12th his Majesty caused all the Artillery of his Camp, and Ships in the *Elbe*, to be thrice discharged for the taking of *Buda*.

London, Sept. 17. This day *Edward Thornton*, late Soldier in the Earl of *Huntington's* Regiment, was Executed at *Tyburn* according to the Sentence past upon him at the last Sessions at the *O.d.Bayb*, for having deserted his Colours.
