THIS day had audience of Her Majesty;
The Baron André Jean-Simon, Minister
Plenipotentiary from the Emperor of Hayti, to
deliver his credentials;

To which he was introduced by the Earl of Clarendon, K.G., Her Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs.

The Queen has been pleased to constitute the Island of Labuan, and its dependencies, to be a Bishop's see and diocese, to be called the Bishopric of Labuan, and to appoint the Reverend Francis Thomas Macdougall, D.C.L., to be ordained and consecrated Bishop of the said see.

The Queen has been pleased to appoint William Eccles, Esq., to be a Member of the Legislative Council of the Island of Trinidad; W. T. Bridges, Esq., to be a Member of the Legislative Council of the Island of Hong Kong, during the absence of Paul Joy Stirling, Esq., a Member of that Board; and Thomas Icely, Esq., to be a non-elective Member of the Legislative Council of the Colony of New South Wales.

THE Minister of Marine gives notice, that on the south side of the navigable channel of the Sea

Gat of Brouwershaven, between the buoys No. 2 and 3 of the "Nieuwe Zand," another white buoy has been placed, in the following bearings or marks:

The Great Steeple of Veere, S.W. ½ W.
The Stone Elevation at North Schouwen, E.S.E.
The Revolving Light of West Schouwen, S.S.E.
in 90 palms of water.
