Gat of Brouwershaven, between the buoys No. 2 and 3 of the "Nieuwe Zand," another white buoy has been placed, in the following bearings or marks :

The Great Steeple of Veere, S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W.  
The Stone Elevation at North Schouwen, E.S.E.  
The Revolving Light of West Schouwen, S.S.E. in 90 palms of water.
