

chace to them; That the *Turks* finding they could not escape, run the said Ship (which was formerly taken from this State by the *Tripolins*, being called the *St. Joseph*) on ground, and set her on Fire, but the other Vessels were taken.

From the Imperial Camp at *Fuldowar*, Sept. 14. The 10th Instant we encamped between this place and *Pondell*; The same day the Duke of *Lorraine* gave Orders for the laying a Bridge there over the *Danube*, which was finished the 11th. The 12th, part of the Army passed that River, with Orders to possess themselves of the several Posts which the *Turks* are Masters of on that side. We have Advice that they have already abandoned *Colocza*, *Baya*, *Almatz*, *Hard*, and *Paxi*, after having removed their Cannon and Ammunition, and laid those places in Ashes. Yesterday the Army came to this place, and to morrow we shall decamp again, to continue our march towards *Batafek*.

From the Imperial Camp at *Paris*, Sept. 16. The Duke of *Lorraine* and the Elector of *Bavaria* arrived here yesterday about Noon at the Head of the Imperial Army; Orders were immediately given for the fixing in this place the Bridge of Boats which was brought from *Fuldowar*, and several Parties of Horse were sent out, who advanced as far as the River *Sarwitz*, without meeting with any Turkish Troops. The Elector of *Bavaria* will, it's believed, leave the Army in few days, and return to *Vienna*. General *Caraffa* is named to command the Troops that are to besiege *Sogedin*; But the design upon the Bridge of *Blecke* will hardly be executed at this time, the Country being so extremely ruined, that the Troops would not be able to subsist in their march thither. The *Turks* have likewise abandoned *Tula*. We have Advice that the Troops of *Croatia* have taken and plundered the Town of *Five Churches*; They will endeavour to make themselves likewise Masters of the *Castle*.

Vienna, Sep. 22. The Imperial Army having made a halt near a place called *Pontele*, below the Isle of *St. Margaret*, to expell the Vessels with Provisions and other Necessaries, decamped the 23th, and marched to *Paxt*. The *Turks*, upon their approach, abandoned the small places they were possessed of as well on this as the other side of the *Danube*. The Letters from *Buda* of the 19th Instant tell us, That 1000 *Turks*, who have been Confined, and all the Prisoners are daily at work with a great many Malons and Carpenters. To repair the Fortifications of that place; That there had been found in one of the Towers of the *Castle* a great many old Books as well Printed as Manuscripts; And that a great deal of Riches of Money, Plate, and Household Goods, which had been hid during the Siege, was daily discovered. The Jews that were Prisoners, have been ransomed by their Brethren at 100 Rxdollars a Man. The same Letters say, That the *Turks* have abandoned *Hatwan*, the Garrison that was there retiring to *Agnia*.

Hamburg, Octob. 1. The Ministers of the Princess, who employ their Offices on the behalf of this City, have followed the King of *Denmark* to *Copenhagen* to sollicite the Reliance of our Ships and Effects. It's said Sentence will be pronounced on Friday next against *Jastram* and *Schutger*. The Danish Forces are returned to their Quarters in *Holstein*.

Brussels, Octob. 1. Our Governor-General having received an account that some French Troops had on the 24th of the last month appeared in the neighborhood of *Namur*, and had there set up in 3 several places the Arms of the Most Christian King, to shew the extent of the French Limits, his Excellency called together a Juncto of the Council of State, and with their advice resolved to reinforce the Garrisons of *Maa*, *Charleroy*, and *Namur*, and to dispatch the Count *Delval* to *Paris*, and Monsieur *de Fuy* to *Holland*.

Brussels, Octob. 2. His Excellency went yesterday to *Irveuren*, intending to go from thence this morning to the *Abby of Villers*, where the Prince de *Barbançon*, Governor of *Namur* was to meet him. We are told that some French Troops are drawing together near *Pont Epiere*. The Letters from *Vienna* of the 22d Instant tell us, That the Imperial Army was encamped the 22d inst at *Paxt* near the *Danube*,

Hague, Octob. 4. The States of *Holland* are adjourned till the 15th of the next Month. The Baron de *Fay*, Governor of *Brussels*, is come hither from the Governor of the Spanish Netherlands, Prince *Philip of Brattenburgh* is expected here the next week.

Paris, Octob. 5. The Ambassadors of *Siam* had on Sunday last a private Audience of the King at *Verfailles*. They parted from hence this day, to visit the places of the New Conquest in *Flanders*. The Court will remove the next week to *Fontainbleau*.

Windfor, Sept. 26. His Majesty was this day pleased to confer the Honour of Knighthood upon *Thomas Fowle* Esq; one of the Aldermen of the City of *London*.

His Majesty has appointed Sir *Thomas Rawlinson* and Sir *Thomas Fowle* to be Sheriffs of *London* and *Middlesex* for the Year ensuing.
