AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 28th day of August, 1855,

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords of the Council, having taken into consideration certain applications for leave to export various articles, of which the exportation is prohibited to any place in Europe north of Dunkirk, or in the Mediterranean Sea east of Malta, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the prohibition to export such articles to any place east of Malta shall cease, with the exception of gunpowder, saltpetre, brimstone, nitrate of soda, sulphate of potash, muriate of potash (chloride of potassium), arms, and ammunition of every kind, including lead, with regard to which the prohibition is to remain in force;

Whereof the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Commissioners of Customs, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

THE Lords of the Council, having taken into consideration the expediency of prohibiting the exportation of certain additional articles capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of military and naval stores (in pursuance of Her Majesty's proclamation of the eighteenth February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four), are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered that the Officers of Her Majesty's Customs do hereafter prevent the exportation of the following articles: viz., rivet iron, angle iron, rivets, strips of iron, low moor and bowling plates, sheet plate iron exceeding a quarter of an inch, and round bars of from five-eighths to three-quarters of an inch in diameter, to any place in Europe north of Dunkirk; and that the Officers of Her Majesty's Customs do permit the export of the articles herein-mentioned to any other part of the world upon taking from the persons exporting the same a bond that they shall be landed and entered at the port of destination:

Whereof the Lords Commissioners of Her

Majesty's Treasury, and the Commissioners of Customs, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

WHEREAS Her Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches have, in pursuance of the sixteenth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes," and of the third section of an Act, passed in the session of Parliament held in the second and third years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the assignment of ecclesiastical districts to churches or chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and for other purposes," or of any other powers in such behalf contained in the Church Building Acts, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the thirty-first day of July; one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, in the words following; viz.:

"Your Majesty's Commissioners for building new churches beg leave humbly to represent that having taken into consideration all the circumstances of the parish of Streatham, in the county of Surrey and diocese of Winchester, it appears to them to be expedient that particular districts should be assigned to the consecrated churches of Saint Mary at Balham and the Holy Trinity at Upper Tooting, in the parish of Streatham, under the powers contained in the sixteenth section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the fifty-ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled 'An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes,' and in the third section of an Act of Parliament, passed in the second and third years of your Majesty's reign, intituled 'An Act to make better provision for the assignment of

'ecclesiastical districts to churches or chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and for other purposes,' or of any other powers in this behalf contained in the Church, Building Acts, and that such proposed district should be respectively named or called 'the District Chapelry of Saint Mary, Streatham,' and 'the District Chapelry of Upper Tooting,' and that the boundaries thereof should be those hereinafter mentioned; that is to say: the District Chapelry of Saint Mary, Streatham, is bounded on the north and north-east and east by the parish of Clapham, to the boundary post, in or near to Bleak Hall-lane, near to the extreme west corner of the district of Christ Church, and it is thence bounded on the south-east, south, and west by the remaining part of the parish of Streatham, from which the said District Chapelry is separated by a straight line running in a south-westerly direction from such boundary post in Bleak Hall-lane, across Tooting Beck-common, to the lodge and gates at the termination on such common of Bedford-hill-road, then along the northern side of such common, round the enclosure of Bedford-hill House and grounds, until it reaches the watercourse belonging to the Commissioners of Sewers, and then along the middle of such watercourse to the parish of Clapham, at the north-west corner of the district, and which district is more particularly delineated on the map hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured green, and surrounded by a verge coloured red.

"The District Chapelry of Upper Tooting is bounded on the north-east and north by the parish of Clapham, on the west and north-west by the parish of Wandsworth, on the south by the parish of Tooting, and on the east by the before-mentioned district of Saint Mary, Streatham, from which it is divided by the watercourse belonging to the Commissioners of Sewers, a line in the middle of which forms the boundary between the said districts of Saint Mary, Streatham, and Upper Tooting, as such District Chapelry is more particularly delineated on the said plan hereto annexed, and thereon coloured pink and surrounded by a verge coloured yellow.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners beg leave further to represent that it also appears to them to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and also burials (in the event of a proper burial-ground being provided for either of the said churches) should be solemnized or performed in the said church of Saint Mary, Streatham, and also in the said church of the Holy Trinity, at Upper Tooting aforesaid; and that the fees to arise from marriages, baptisms, and churchings, should on the assignment of the districts belong respectively and be paid to the minister or incumbent of each such church for the time being, and that the fees to arise from burials in the event of burial-grounds being provided for either or both of the said churches at a future time, should belong to the rector of the parish, at the time of the annexation of such burial-grounds or burial-ground during his incumbency, and after his avoidance of the rectory that such fees should respectively belong and be paid to the incumbents of the respective churches.

"That the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Richard, Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester, has been obtained thereto, as required by the Acts and sections hereinbefore mentioned, in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this representation.

"Your Majesty's said Commissioners therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously

pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your royal wisdom, shall seem meet."

Her Majesty having taken the said representation, together with the map and plan therein referred to, and which are thereunto annexed, into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the proposed assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Mary, at Balham, and the Holy Trinity, at Upper Tooting, in the parish of Streatham, be accordingly made, and that the recommendations of the said Commissioners in respect of the publication of banns and the solemnization of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and also burials (in the event of a proper burial-ground being provided for either of the said churches) in the said churches, and the fees to arise therefrom, be carried into effect agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts; and Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Winchester.
