THE Queen has been pleased to grant unto Edward-Downes Panter, a Mate in Her Majesty's Navy, now serving on board the Duke of Wellington, in the Baltic, eldest son of Frederick-Downes Panter, Clerk, Master of Arts, Rector of Rushford with Brettenham, in the county of Norfolk, who is the eldest son of John-Leach Panter, of Whitchurch, in the county of Hereford, but formerly of North End Lodge, in the parish of Fulham, in the county of Middlesex, Esquire, by Sarah his late wife, daughter of Peter Downes and sister and heir of Edward Downes, both late of Shrigley Worth and Butley, in the county palatine of Chester, Esquires, deceased, Her royal licence and authority, that he may, in compliance with a request contained in a codicil annexed to the last will and testament of his grandmother the said Sarah Panter, take and henceforth use the surname of Downes, in addition to and after that of Panter, and also bear the arms of Downes; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office, otherwise the said royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations

have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Monte Video, enclosing a translation of certain regulations, dated 30th March, for the establishment and government of a Society of Pilots at that port, with tariffs of the charges the pilots are to be allowed to make.

Article 3.—The Society of Pilots shall have a vessel for its cruising service, which shall be carried on between the Islands of Flores and Lobos.
