Buda, Sept. 22. The 20th Inftant 13 Prices of Cannon for Battery, and fix Mortars, with the neceflary Ammunition, were fent from hence to the Army. Several thouland Men are at work here to level the Lines and other Works, to empty the Ditches, and to repair the Houfes that have fuitained the leaft damage; A great deal of Riches of Silver, Gold and Jewels has been found among the Ruines of thofe that were blown up and burnt during the Siege, and it's not to be doubted but mach more lies fitll hid. Yetterday fome of our Huffars met a party of Janifaries on Horfeback belonging to the Garion of alba Regalis, whom they put to flight, and brcught hither 23 Prifoners, Thefe report that the Viffer before his Retreat reinforced that Garifon to $8000 \mathrm{Men}_{\text {, }}$ and mounted all the Janifaries, that they might be the better able to difturb the Imperialifts with their excurfons during the the Winter. The Garifon of this place is compofed of the Regiments of Saime, Dependal and Befcke, a Battalion of Saxons,one of Brandenburgers, one of Bavarranf, and one of the Troops of the Circles, apd 3000 Huffars .
